This summer saw the 226<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Presbyterian Church (USA) General Assembly - a biannual gathering of commissioners from across the nation for the purpose of discussing and voting on questions relevant to the governance and mission of our denomination. This year's GA, themed "Live into Hope", convened in Salt Lake City, Utah, from June 25 to July 4. Here are some highlights from this year's session:

- In total, 12 proposed changes to the PC(USA) Book of Order were passed, affecting ordination standards, nondiscriminatory practices, temporary and installed pastoral relationships, and vulnerable adult protection policies. The changes are now referred to the presbyteries for approval. If a majority of presbyteries agree, the changes will be incorporated in the 2025-2027 edition of the Book of Order. A joint ecumenical statement with the Episcopalian Church will also be up for consideration.
- Jihyun Oh was elected as the new Stated Clerk of the denomination. Oh, the former director of Mid Council Ministries in the Office of the General Assembly, replaces interim Stated Clerk Bronwen Boswell, who assumed the role after Dr. J. Herbert Nelson's II resignation last year.
- Rev. CeCe Armstrong and Rev. Tony Larson were elected Co-Moderators of the General Assembly for the upcoming two-year term. Both pastors hail from the South Carolina Low Country and are the fifth consecutive team of Co-Moderators to be elected to that position.
- The GA voted 389-24 to include "gender identity" and "sexual orientation" to the list of the "rich diversity" of the church identified in F-1.0403 of the Book of Order, alongside race, ethnicity, sex, disability, geography, and theological conviction. A narrower vote of 297–130 authorized presbyteries to consider a candidate's views on diversity when seeking ordination in the PC(USA).
- By a vote of 264-146, commissioners rejected an overture for the immediate divestment of PC(USA) financial holdings from fossil fuel companies in favor of a strategy of prolonged corporate engagement.
- The GA reaffirmed a resolution from the 216<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (2004) that declared Christian Zionism to be inconsistent with Reformed theology, and endorsed the creation of study materials to educate Presbyterians as to what Christian Zionism is, and the obstacle it poses to the creation of a lasting peace in the Middle East.
- A decision to recognize the National Caucus of Korean Presbyterian Churches (NCKPC) as an official caucus in the PC(USA) was postponed until the next stated meeting of the GA due to concerns over the organization's treatment of women pastors.
- The Assembly voted to reduce the current number of annual Special Offerings from four to three for 2026. The Pentecost Offering will be phased out with supported ministries incorporated into the Christmas Joy Offering. The Peace & Global Witness Offering will be changed to the World Communion Offering with proceeds distributed by grants instead of percentages allocated through presbyteries and
- The GA unanimously approved a resolution calling for action to reduce gun violence affecting children through the encouragement of gun safety, proper storage, and personal accountability.
- The GA clarified current boundaries among the PC(USA)'s 16 synods and authorized the creation of a permanent Administrative Commission on Mid Councils that would be charged with evaluating and reorganizing the geographic boundaries of synods and presbyteries without the need for a full vote of the GA.
- The GA voted overwhelmingly to accept the invitation of the Presbytery of Milwaukee to host the 227th General Assembly from June 23 to July 2, 2026.

Thank you to all the volunteers who have faithfully served as well as to YOU for considering this important ministry to the smallest of God's children!



Communities in Schools

Shallotte Presbyterian Church supports Brunswick County schools through donations from the Mission Committee budget to Communities in Schools Brunswick County (CIS). The CIS mission is: To surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life.

One of the Brunswick County CIS programs is called <u>Action for Success</u> which is an evidence-based drop-out prevention program in all Brunswick County middle schools, Lincoln Elementary, Jessie Mae Monroe Elementary, Supply Elementary, and Waccamaw School that works by building relationships that remove the barriers to learning and improve ways our community responds to needs of at-risk students and their families.

Here are a few ways you can help:

- Mentor a student
- Tutor a student
- Donate needed school supplies
- Read to or listen to a reader
- Furnish clothing for children in need
- Join a child for school lunch (Lunch Buddy program)
- Participate in Career Day
- Donate financially to support the program
