As part of a major academic overhaul, my alma mater, Union Presbyterian Seminary, recently announced that, starting in 2026, the Richmond Campus would be switching a hybrid educational model – that is to say, it will effectively end full-time student enrollment to instead focus on remote learning. Classes will now meet largely online, supplemented by periodic visits to campus throughout the academic year. The idea behind the switch is to make a theological education more accessible to people with existing work and family obligations, or who live in areas not convenient to seminary facilities. The model itself is nothing new. The UPS campus in Charlotte has been engaged in hybrid education since its founding in 2002. But such a shift in academic focus for the Richmond campus has naturally been the source of much angst among pastors who, like me, entered into and graduated from seminary as full-time students.

Personally, I support the seminary's decision to make this switch. It makes sense, and it couldn't have been an easy decision to end 214 years of academic tradition. The decision addresses the needs of a changing church driven by technological advances impacting wider society. But more than this, it reflects the reality in which the church finds itself, and I'm encouraged that there's enough maturity to recognize this. As church membership and participation in mainline Protestantism continues to decline in our nation, there simply aren't enough congregations who can offer full-time installed positions to seminary graduates. Thus, the church finds itself increasingly reliant on "bi-vocational" (or, part-time) pastors who can supplement their ministries with income from the private sector.

What we are seeing, however, is not the end of theological education, but the next evolution of it. Like most changes, it's neither good nor bad, it's just different. Indeed, when I was in seminary, one could already see the long-term effect of institutional change taking place, as enrollment was merely a fraction of its former size. Even so, the seminary maintained a vibrant student body through which I met many lifelong friends and colleagues (not to mention my wife!), so naturally, for those of us who were blessed to experience such, there will be a period of mourning as we lament the loss of that community.

My hope is that seminary leaders have anticipated these challenges and are presently taking steps to forge the same sense of connectedness among their students under the new model. If there are no more than "six degrees of separation" from anyone else in the nation, among Presbyterians it is even less so, with the majority of those connections formed through the denomination's 17,000+ ordained pastors – connections that are difficult to replicate online. Just as the church always has, the PC (USA) and its seminaries will continue to adapt their ministries according to the needs of a changing world. But the preservation of community will be a crucial test as the church seeks to remain a relevant institution in the 21st century and beyond.




Presbyterian Women Summer Project and Celebration Circle

Shallotte Presbyterian Church supports Brunswick County schools through donations from the Mission Committee budget to Communities in Schools Brunswick County (CIS). Our church mainly concentrates on assisting Shallotte Middle School and Union Elementary School through monetary donations and various voluntary opportunities. The Mission Committee asks for your prayers, time, and/or talents for all our community's schools' staff and students.

The CIS mission is: To surround students with a community of support, empowering them to stay in school and achieve in life.

One of the Brunswick County CIS programs is called **Action for Success** which is an evidence -based drop-out prevention program in all Brunswick County middle schools, Lincoln Elementary, Jessie Mae Monroe Elementary, Supply Elementary, and Waccamaw School that works by building relationships that remove the barriers to learning and improve ways our community responds to needs of at-risk students and their families.
