AFUMC & SCOUTING HISTORY

Celebrating 90 Years

The year 2026 marks the 90th anniversary of the Troop 1 charter at Athens First United Methodist Church.

Troop 1 organized at the YMCA in the early 1930s, and on Feb 4, 1936, the Athens Banner-Herald reported that Troop 1 was working to recharter with AFUMC. That recharter was successful, and Troop 1 is the last active Troop that predates the organization of the modern Scouting America Northeast Georgia Council.

AFUMC sponsored other scouting units prior to the 1930s, but these early years were disorganized with units assembling and disbanding frequently until after the Great Depression. There is a long history of the Church supporting Scouting, and we are grateful for the lasting relationship with AFUMC.



BSA SCOUT TROOP 1 | *boys, grades 6-12*

The Mission of the Scouting America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

Scouts of Troop 1 learn Scout skills and values through weekly meetings and monthly trips. Adventures this year included canoeing in the Okefenokee, tubing in Helen, kayaking the Broad River, Summer Camp at Camp Rainey Mountain, Backpacking in North Georgia Mountains, and indoor skydiving. This year we will participate in a Klondike Derby, backpacking at Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico, Summer Camp at Camp Woodruff, and more. One Scout earned the highest rank of Eagle, and several are working on their Eagle requirements.

Troop 1 has 16 Scouts and is always looking for more boys in 6-12th grade looking for fun, adventure, service, and leadership opportunities. Our partnership with First United Methodist Church is critical to the success of our Troop in instilling moral values into our Scouts. We appreciate all the support the Church provides and the invitation to participate in Church activities like Scout Sunday. Troop 1 meets at First United Methodist Church from 3:00-4:00 p.m. on Sundays.

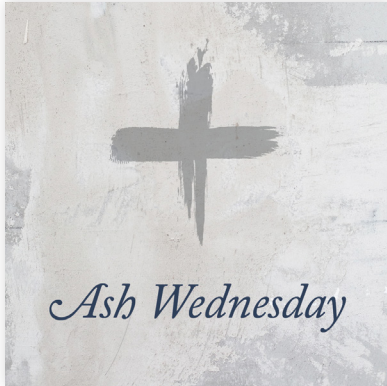

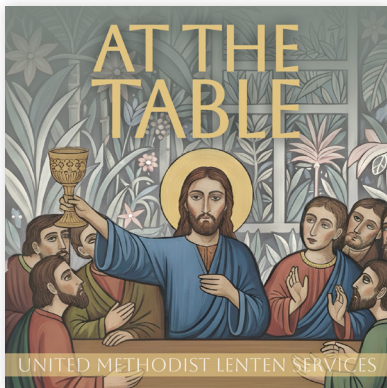
