Home Group Leader's Notes Week of October 8, 2023

Sermon Series: Called

"Called" is a series on what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. The beginning of a relationship with Jesus and God is answering the "call" to follow Jesus. We reviewed the meaning of His words of invitation, to repent and believe, which are the starting place of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

Pastor Bill Born has described discipleship in terms of being like a large tree with roots, a trunk, and four branches. This week, we will focus on two branches: call into fellowship and called to be like Jesus. We will begin this week's notes by listening to God's glorious plans for those who follow Jesus.

The focus this week is on the first two "branches" of discipleship. The first branch is actually the "trunk" – it is fellowship with God and one another. Throughout the Bible, we see that God created us to be in an intimate relationship with Him and one another. Jesus promised eternal life to those who believe in / follow Him. Jesus summarized what this means in John 17:3: Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent." This is why God made us – to know Him in His fullness. Everything else in life flows from our intimacy, our fellowship with, our knowing God. The second branch is a calling to be "like Jesus. Because we delight in God and want to be with Him, our second calling is to become like Him in His character and ways. We want to love and live like Jesus.
