



Introduction to the Book

The book of Malachi is a hinge...a pivot point...an axis...in the Bible.

You'll probably remember that God's Shekeinah glory returning to the temple was something the prophet Ezekiel (40-43) had foretold happening after the return.

BUT the real problem for them...and for us...was not really God's performance...rather it was...and is...with their...and our...perspectives and performance.

7 conversations in Malachi

- 1:2 God tells them of His love for them but they reply "How have You, loved us?"
- 1:6 God accuses them of disrespecting Him, and they counter with "How have we despised Your name...and polluted You?"
- 1:12 God charges them with engaging in lackadaisical worship and they respond with a tissue to the nose.. "What a weariness this all is! Sniff, Snort!"
- 2:13-14 God tells them He will no longer respond to them with favor, and they react with a clueless "Why do You not respond to us with favor?"
- 2:17 God states that they have exhausted Him with all their empty words and they are shocked... "How have we wearied You?"
- 3:7-8 God calls them on the carpet for being distant and keeping back from Him what He is due...And they reply with oblivious clueless ignorance "How are we to return? How have we robbed You?"
- 3:13 God challenges them to examine their bitter attitudes and accusations that He is a skin-flint God...and they react with surprise saying "How have we spoken against You?

Here is a simple outline of the fuel for intense faith and the book:

God's Goodness is Compelling – so we should give Him the best of what we have, 1:1-14

God's Spiritual Leaders are Infecting – so we must look to them for integrity of life and faithful instruction, *2:1-16*

God's Presence is Refining – so we can react with genuine awe, 2:17-3:5

God's Character is Unchanging – so we should respond with determined and generous trust, 3:6-4:6
