Read the text completely, then come back and discuss the questions.

What does it mean to Honor someone? How can learning obedience and honor at a young age bless you in life? How can not learning those become a hinderance to you? How do you see the benefit of having a parent guide you in this life?

⁴ Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

⁵ Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. ⁶ Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but as slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. ⁷ Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not people, ⁸ because you know that the Lord will reward each one for whatever 4.
