God's Perfecting Work in Paul's Circumstances:
Greater Progress of the Gospel,
Philippians 1:12-20

Philippians 1:12 Now I want you to know, brethren, that my circumstances have turned out for the greater progress of the gospel

Progress...comes from the It combines πρό (pro, "forward/before") + κόπτω (koptō, "to cut, strike, or chop"). Has a military origin.

The core image is one of clearing obstacles—literally "chopping down" or hacking through impediments (like dense forest, underbrush, or barriers) to create a path forward.

This etymology reflects a vivid, practical picture from the ancient world: progress isn't effortless movement but advancement against resistance, requiring effort to remove barriers.

Philippians 1:12 Now I want you to know, brethren, that my circumstances have turned out for the greater progress of the gospel

Paul is assuming the church understood this word, Gospel. Paul expounds on the content of this message later in the letter, specifically in Philippians 2 and especially in Philippians 3.

The Gospel message is this. First and foremost it is about the person of Jesus Christ and His life and ministry at the will of God the Father for the sake of His honor and for our good.

Philippians 1:13-14 so that my imprisonment in the cause of Christ has become well known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to everyone else, and that most of the brethren, trusting in the Lord because of my imprisonment, have far more courage to speak the word of God without fear.

The assumption that the imprisonment would hinder the gospel is challenged here. Notice that even in the imprisonment, Paul made this about Christ.

Not everyone has pure motives in their confidence. Some are using this to attack Paul and advance their own ministry.

Just a few weeks ago someone, not a church member, said to my face, "that's why your ministry is so ineffective."

Generally speaking we should be pulling for all gospel oriented ministries. Notice Paul's attitude about this.

Philippians 1:15 Some, to be sure, are preaching Christ even from envy and strife, but some also from good will;

Philippians 1:16-17 the latter do it out of love, knowing that I am appointed for the defense of the gospel; the former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition rather than from pure motives, thinking to cause me distress in my imprisonment.

Philippians 1:18 What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and in this I rejoice.

Contrast of Paul's attitude between Philippians 1 and Galatians 1

Galatians 1:6-7 I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; which is really not another; only there are some who are disturbing you and want to distort the gospel of Christ.

Galatians 1:8-9 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to what we have preached to you, he is to be accursed! As we have said before, so I say again now, if any man is preaching to you a gospel contrary to what you received, he is to be accursed!

Philippians 1:18 What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed; and in this I rejoice.
