5-Day Devotional Based on ACTS 2:1-13

Day 1: The Promise of the Holy Spirit

"When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested^[a] on each one of them. ⁴ And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:1-4

As the day of Pentecost arrived, the disciples were gathered together, waiting expectantly for the Holy Spirit, just as Jesus had promised. Their obedience in waiting allowed them to experience the profound power of the Spirit. This moment underscores the importance of waiting on God's promises and being ready to receive what He has in store for us.

Action Steps:

- **1. Practice Stillness:** Spend 10-15 minutes in silence today, intentionally waiting on God. Ask Him to reveal His promises to you.
