THE HOLY EUCHARIST: Rite 2

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY

THE WORD OF GOD

PRELUDE OPENING HYMN

The people standing, the Presider says Blessed be God: most holy, glorious, and undivided Trinity. People And blessed be God's reign, now and for ever. Amen.

The Presider may say the Collect of Purity

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid. Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

When appointed, the following **HYMN OF PRAISE** is sung or said, all standing:

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE COLLECT OF THE DAY

The Presider says to the people God be with you. People And also with you.

Presider Let us pray.

The Presider says the Collect of the Day. [See insert.] People Amen.

THE LESSONS

The people sit. One or two Lessons, as appointed, are read, the Reader first saying A Reading from ____. After each Reading, the Reader says Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people. People **Thanks be to God.**

Silence may follow. A **PSALM** follows the first Reading.

[The Second Reading follows the Psalm. Then the SEQUENCE HYMN is sung.]

Then, all standing, a Deacon or a Priest reads the Gospel, first saying

The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to ____. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After the Gospel, the Reader says The Gospel of our Savior. Praise to you, Lord Christ.

THE SERMON

Silence follows the sermon.

RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

All stand.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the

prayers?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human

being?

People: I will, with God's help.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Prayer is offered with intercession for: The Universal Church, its members, and its mission; The Nation and all in authority; The welfare of the world; The concerns of this group here gathered; Those who suffer or are in any trouble; The departed (with commemoration of a saint when appropriate).

CONFESSION OF SIN

The Deacon or Presider says Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

All bow at the waist or kneel, Presider and People say

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Bishop when present, or the Priest, stands and says Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through the grace of Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

THE PEACE

All stand. The Presider says to the people The Peace of Christ be always with you.

People And also with you.

Then the Ministers and People may greet one another in the name of the Lord. Greetings and announcements follow.

The Presider says the Offertory Sentence Walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. Ephesians 5:2

OFFERTORY ANTHEM

THE HOLY COMMUNION

DOXOLOGY

Representatives of the congregation bring the people's offerings of bread and wine, and money or other gifts, to the deacon or presider. The people stand while the offerings are presented and placed on the Altar.

The people remain standing. The Presider, whether bishop or priest, faces them and sings or says

Presider The Lord be with you. People And also with you.

Presider Lift up your hearts. People We lift them to the Lord.

Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Then, facing the Holy Table, the Presider continues

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth.

For in the multitude of your saints you have surrounded us with a great cloud of witnesses, that we might rejoice in their fellowship, and run with endurance the race that is set before us; and, together with them, receive the crown of glory that never fades away.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Presider and People sing or say together

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the Highest.

Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the maker and preserver of all people. Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Presider is to hold it or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Presider and People Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Almighty God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Savior. By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

The Presider sings or says As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray,

People and Presider sing or say

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept. Then may be sung or said a suitable ANTHEM.

Facing the people, the Presider sings or says the following Invitation:

The Gifts of God for the People of God.

COMMUNION HYMN

All are welcome at God's table. If you are not receiving communion, cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing. The bread is received on the open palm. You may guide the chalice to your lips. We do not practice intinction (the dipping of the bread in the wine) in the Diocese of Southeast Florida.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words

The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. [Amen.]

The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. [Amen.]

After Communion, the Presider says Let us pray.

Presider and People Loving God, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son, our Savior, Jesus Christ. And you have fed us with spiritual food in the sacrament of Christ's body and blood. Now send us forth a people forgiven, healed, renewed, that we may proclaim your love to the world and continue in the risen life of Christ our Savior. AMEN.

BLESSING DISMISSAL

Presider Let us go forth in the name of Christ. People Thanks be to God.
