





Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

I will, with God's help.

The Bishop asks the following questions to the candidate who can speak for himself and to the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the child.

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world, which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? I renounce them.

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior? I do.

Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord? I do.

The other Candidate(s) will now be presented.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Bishop touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. ♣ Amen.

#### THE BAPTISMS

The candidates are presented by name to the Bishop, who pours water upon the candidate, saying NAME, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Then the Bishop places a hand on each person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying NAME, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

A haptism candle is lit from the Paschal candle and given to the newly haptized with the following words. NAME, the light of Christ.



### ★ We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory;


And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. AMEN.






