



PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATE

BCP, P. 301

Celebrant

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsors I present NAME to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Celebrant

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents

I will, with God's help.

Celebrant

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ? *Parents and Godparents*

I will, with God's help.

The Celebrant asks the following questions to the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children.

Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world, which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

I renounce them.

Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

I do.

Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

I do.

Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

I do.

After all have been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their lives in Christ?

THE BAPTISM

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who pours water upon the candidate, saying NAME, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Then the Celebrant places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying NAME, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

We await his coming in glory;


And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.
