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LENTEN CHANGES

To reflect the penitential season of Lent, you may notice changes in our worship space and service:

Changes to Worship Space

- Purple altar hangings, vestments, and veiled crosses (the color **representing penitence**).
- No flowers.
- Wood **candelabras at the altar**.
- Other celebratory items and images are put away or concealed by a veil.
- Baptismal font is dry and closed – **Lent is a season of preparation for baptism and at the Great Vigil we will refill the font and rejoice in this reminder of our baptisms.**

Changes to Worship Service

- No spoken welcome announcements at the beginning of the service.
- Ministers process during the introit.
- No entrance hymn used during the season of Lent.
- No Alleluias (except in burial services, and as the choir rehearses for Easter).
- Our services feel more penitential.
 - Opening with “Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins; His mercy endures **for ever.**”,
 - the Confession happens at the beginning, and
 - we **use a Lenten Prayer over the People instead of a blessing.**
- Our service music changes to be more penitential. For example, we **use the Kyrie instead of the Gloria at the beginning of the service.**

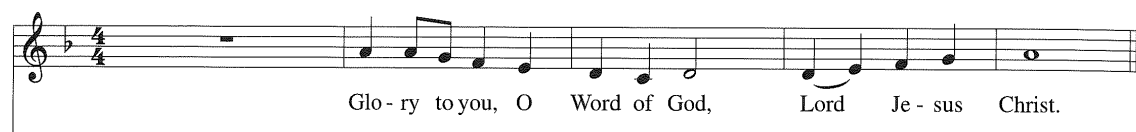

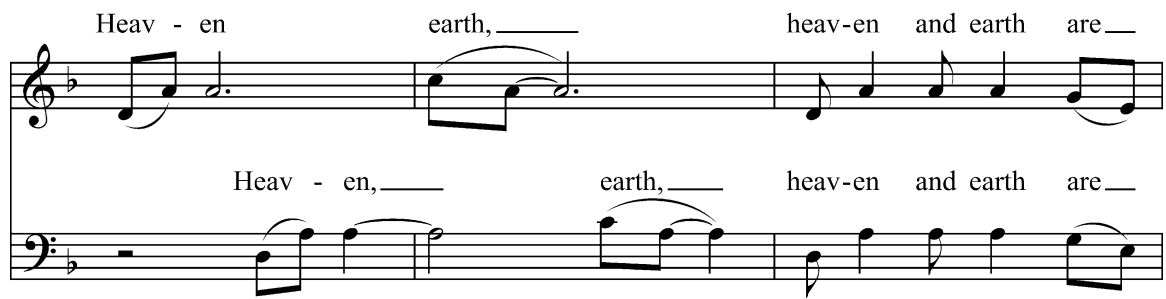

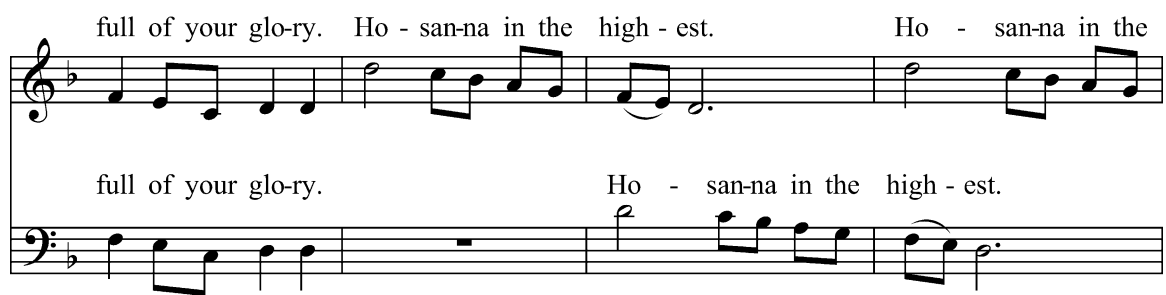

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

✠ **Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.**

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with the Blessed Virgin Mary, blessed David of Wales, and all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. ✠ **AMEN.**

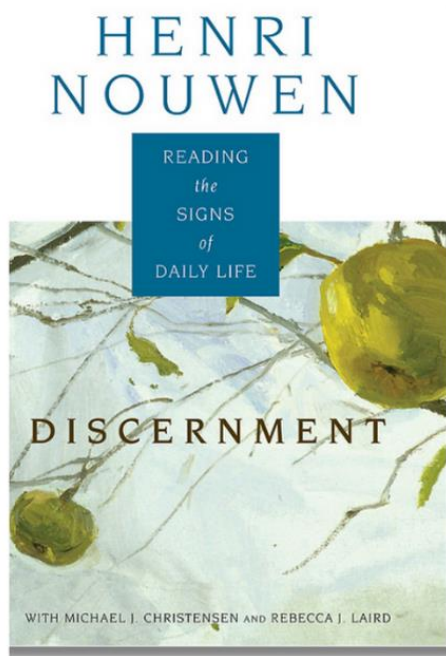
