

## HOLY BAPTISM, CONFIRMATIONS, RECEPTIONS AND REAFFIRMATIONS PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES BCP, P. 301

The Bishop says

The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The candidate who is able to answer for themselves is presented by the Sponsors, as follows.

Presenters: I present this person to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Bishop asks the candidate: Do you desire to be baptized?

Candidate: I do.

Bishop: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Candidate: I renounce them.

Bishop: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy

the creatures of God?

Candidate: I renounce them.

Bishop: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Candidate: I renounce them.

Bishop: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Candidate: I do.

Bishop: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Candidate: I do.

Bishop: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Candidate: I do.

The Bishop says: The other Candidates will now be presented.

Those to be confirmed and their sponsors stand for presentation.

Presenters: I present these persons for Confirmation.

I present *these persons* to be received into this Communion.

I present these persons who desire to reaffirm their baptismal vows.

The Bishop asks the candidates: Do you affirm your renunciation of evil?

Candidate: I do.

Bishop: Do you renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

Candidate: I do, and with God's grace, I will follow him as my Savior and Lord.

After all have been presented, the Bishop addresses the congregation, saying

Bishop:

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God the Father?

■ I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

■ I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

■ I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

At the following words, the Bishop touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. ♣ Amen.

#### THE BAPTISMS

The candidate is presented by name to the Bishop, who pours water upon the candidate, saying N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Then the Bishop places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

Strengthen, O Lord, your servant N. with your Holy Spirit; empower *him* for your service; and sustain *him* all the days of his life. Amen.

For reception

N., we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you. \*\*Amen.





Christ will come again.


