Starting May 6, Dr. Brent Landau will be teaching this Scriptural Foundations course that explores the authorship, theology, and interpretation of the books of James 1 & 2; Peter 1, 2, 3; John; Jude; and Revelation in the New Testament.

St. David's Scriptural Foundations is a two-year certificate program that provides an in-depth exploration of the Old and New Testaments considering their historical contexts, literary characteristics, and relevance for today.

Brent Landau is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Religious Studies at the University of Texas at Austin. Before joining UT in 2013, he served as an Assistant Professor of Religious Studies at the University of Oklahoma and held visiting positions at Boston University and Harvard Divinity School.
