

columbarium



Calvary Lutheran Church offers a sacred resting place for the cremation interment of loved ones. The Columbarium and Memorial Prayer Garden, located in Calvary Park, follows the tradition of the old church-yard cemetery, providing a setting for remembrance and prayer.

Funding for the columbarium is provided through the sale of niches, donor contributions and memorial gifts. The columbarium, including its maintenance and perpetual care, is self-supporting.

Why choose Calvary's columbarium?

- Reserving a niche gives your family peace of mind, leaving one less decision loved ones must make.
- As a final resting place, the columbarium provides a setting of comfort and reassurance that loved ones are cared for.

The purchase of a columbarium niche includes:

- A bronze urn to contain ashes.
- A niche to permanently house one or two urns.
- An etched granite faceplate with name(s) and life dates.

The cost of a niche with faceplate is \$2,500 for one urn; \$2,700 for two urns. Costs associated with cremation are not included.

Calvary is our family's spiritual home. We have memories and close friends dating back to 1974 when my father accepted the position as senior pastor of Calvary. Not only do we have close ties with Calvary, but we also know it is a place that we will always call home.

When my father passed away in 2003, we didn't know what to do with his cremains. The columbarium did not exist; we didn't have a family plot, I didn't even know where my grandparents were buried. Nothing felt right. So when we heard that Calvary was building a columbarium, we knew that this was the special place where we would remember our father.

In the summer of 2012, our family was able to gather for a meaningful memorial service and to place my father's name on the granite faceplate, giving us a great sense of peace. The columbarium is a special place, and it honors the people and the legacy of those whose names are displayed.
