

# A WORD **FROM THE** INTERIM RECTOR

#### THE REV. DOROTHY HARTZOG

My brothers and sisters in Christ's love,



Mother Meghan led you in many good directions and growth. Enter Covid to interrupt or negatively influence many of those: regular worship, outreach, new member ministry, youth and adult formation, financial giving, social gatherings - the list goes on. There are three of these areas that I consider most in need of your immediate attention:

It is not difficult to see that Sunday services in-person attendance is significantly lower, except for the faithful 7:30 group holding steady at an average of eighteen! While in the past months the 10:00 am service attendance has improved by an average of 30% (from approximately 70 to 90), we remain well below the pre-Covid average of 130. Yes, we continue to provide livestream services (thanks to Phil Boaz, Jamie Loy and Bethany Kelly) as a ministry to those who cannot attend in person. This is in no way a substitute for worshipping God in the presence of our brothers and sisters of the Trinity faith community. The Holy Spirit works best among and within us as we gather to sing, pray and feast at the Lord's Table.

Our financial picture is positive greatly due to paying a part-time retired priest who does not require the benefits of pension, Social Security or healthcare contributions. Privott Stroman and the Stewardship Committee's efforts pulled off a somewhat last minute save for pledging the 2023 budget. Thank you Privott, Sheila Foust, Howell Foust, Kendall Welsh, George Mickle, Jack Mitchell, and treasurer Beverly Kimbrough who gives many hours to monitor our finances. Sadly, we learned that a very small percentage of Trinity members pledge to fund each year's budget and a significant number give nothing at all.

The third area of concern is the failure of many members to take an active role in any ministry at all!Folks, Trinity has some of the warmest pews in town! While many sit (if they attend in person at all), we have had to cancel Youth ministry activities, Wednesday night suppers, evangelism activities and some social and Red Door fund-raising events. Several of our Outreach ministries need additional workers to thrive or continue.

One of the most inexplicable failures is our inability to staff the nursery with volunteers to supplement or substitute for our fantastic and dedicated paid caregivers who never get to worship in "big church" or get a Sunday off. The Altar Guild needs new members, as does the Flower Guild. Persons handy with a paintbrush, toilet plunger or hammer are needed. Pastoral care events like funeral receptions need persons to serve and cleanup, as do all events on the campus. continued...



Worship is the cornerstone of a Christian's life and those who are faithful in that are to be commended; but I must ask you to search your hearts as to why you feel that warming a pew once a week or occasionally is all that God is asking of you. Has God not given you talents to be used in God's ministry? Has God not blessed you in numerous ways in your life? Did Christ die so that we might simply sit and enjoy the fruit of others' work who sing, clean, plan and give their money and their time and skills, yet never work to share the good news of God's love for all?

There IS lots of good news to be found at Trinity in the success of Christian Formation classes, especially for children and adults (leaders **Lynne Halliburton**, Children's Chapel; **Anne Finley**, Godly Play; **Kendall Welsh** and **Maryalice Telford**, adults) and the success of Education for Ministry, taught for years by **Mark Hunter**.

It's found in new outreach initiatives like Judy's Hope, LGBTQ+ ministries and Suicide Prevention, plus the soon-to-begin Beloved Community, an anti-racism initiative of our diocese. Good news abounds in new persons who continue to find us, along with those being baptized and confirmed. Good news is especially evident in the hard work of **Anne Finley and the Pastoral Care Committee**. I could go on and on, and we will recognize some of these at today's meeting.

Our staff is the best and their loyalty to God and to Trinity is undeniable. **Kelly Loy** and **Lisa Méjeun**, nursery caregivers, **Anne Glass** and **Virginia Boaz**, our musicians.

There are three persons who "hold me up" as I attempt to do the work of a younger priest at a more, a-hem, advanced age! **Chris Smith**, lead verger and my co-chair of Worship and Liturgy on the Parish Ministries Council, does a mammoth job of planning meaningful and appropriate worship.Plus, he has a very full-time paid job! Chris' motto sheds light on his value to me: "The priest is always right!" Thank you, Chris, for making me look as good as possible up front!

The second person is closely related to the first: **Kate Smith**, Senior Warden and wife to Chris. Only those who have held this office truly know the pressures and responsibilities involved; but to add to those, Kate has held the position through part of Covid closures, reopening, the leaving of a priest, beginning a rector search process and hiring an Interim Priest. She has showered me with support and made me a true partner in Trinity's ministries and is unsurpassed in her dedication to God and Trinity.

Lastly is my daily (and I do mean daily – all seven!) partner in crime, **Bethany Kelly**, parish administrator extraordinaire. You may think you know what she does, but I can assure you it's far more. We hired Bethany in the last few months of my first interim term in 2015, so it is such a pleasure to work with her again and appreciate how she has grown in her work and professionalism. She is invaluable to me and to this parish and a joy to have as a coworker in Christ's ministry here at Trinity.

So much more is on my heart to say to you. Thank you for giving me this unexpected time among you, for your patience with me, for sharing your hearts and lives with me. May the time we continue to be together reflect our gladness in serving a loving God who calls us to love without exception.

# A MESSAGE FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

Beloved Trinity family,

Looking back, I see 2022 as our long, slow recovery year. We have emerged from the worst of the pandemic with new members and new ministries, but we still aren't back to full health yet.

This time last year, we were still reeling from our priest leaving, not knowing what we would do for an interim, and constantly worrying about congregation members and their families who were suffering from COVID. I can tell you all now that the end of 2021 through the spring of 2022 was one of the most demanding times I can remember. Finding supply priests and handling day-to-day church matters were a constant challenge, many ministries were short of volunteers, and energy to re-engage in our common life was low. Everything seemed to be a struggle.

Just a few months later, however, we all breathed a group sigh of relief when the Rev. Dorothy Hartzog agreed to be our Interim Rector. Many congregation members fondly remember Dorothy from her time as our associate rector and as interim rector before we called the Rev. Meghan Ryan.

Having Dorothy return was just what we needed. Her warm pastoral care, great sense of humor, and thought-provoking sermons have been a comfort during rough times. As senior warden, I especially appreciated having someone who already knows me and Trinity's history to work with. We owe Dorothy a huge thank you for coming back and shepherding us during this transitional time.

We also celebrated 190 years of Trinity Parish in Clarksville this summer. It was a good reminder to me that even though this past year has been challenging, our beautiful limestone church and the faithful congregation that has worshipped in those walls have been through harder times before and will continue to stand strong. I was excited to see new congregation members as well as former parishioners come together to celebrate and worship with us over the three days of events. We had more than 300 people attend the various events and service over the weekend.

Our greatest development last fall was the revival of our adult formation classes thanks to the guidance of Rev. Dorothy, Mary Alice Telford and Kendall Welsh. With a steady stream of classes on Sundays and Wednesdays, we have seen larger Sunday school and Wednesday night study attendance than we have in years. If you haven't checked out a class yet, pick one and join in!

And finally, thanks to hard work by our Stewardship Committee, we have seen more new givers, a huge increase in recurring pledges, and a budget that will meet our needs for the coming year with little to no need to panic. Thank you to the Stewardship Committee, led admirably by Privott Stroman, for your unceasing work in communicating the congregation's financial needs and helping us meet our goals. And thank you to all our pledgers – like public radio and public television say, we couldn't do it without your support!

The Search Committee is making steady progress in helping us call our next rector, and I am excited to say that with the recovery I've seen us make in the past 12 months, I feel we will have much more to celebrate in 2023. As always, it is a great honor to be your senior warden, and I thank God for the work He is doing in His people at 317 Franklin Street.

# THE REV. DOROTHY HARTZOG & CHRIS SMITH, LEAD VERGER, CO-CHAIRS



For worship and liturgy at Trinity, 2022 has been a year of getting back to normal and trying new things! After several weeks of rotating through supply priests and Morning Prayer at the end of 2021, for most of 2022 we were blessed with having a regular priest with us every Sunday in Interim Rector the Rev. Dorothy Hartzog. With COVID kept at bay by God's miracle of a vaccine, we've been able to bring back in-person Eucharist:

- Returning to the optional common cup for Communion.
- Introducing a more sanitary Communion practice where only the priest intincts (dips) the bread.

And, during this interim period while we search for a new rector, Dorothy has carefully led us through some new experiences:

- Returning to weekly use of the Book of Common Prayer as part of our worship experience.
- Trying on alternate forms of the Eucharistic Prayer and the Lord's Prayer.
- Asperging the congregation during every celebration of Baptism.

Liturgical changes such as these remind us that there are a great many traditions and variations on liturgy within the Episcopal church; trying them on for a while helps to prepare us for a new priest, who may have even more changes in mind as we embark on the next season of our worship together. Trinity's worship is made possible by three overlapping groups of people:

The people of Trinity Parish listen and respond to God's call for us to be the hands of Christ in the world. Outreach is the parish's work beyond its walls. It is how we seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbors as ourselves. It is how we strive for justice and peace among all people, respecting the dignity of every human being.

#### **OUTREACH GRANT**

Trinity's Outreach funded two projects in 2022:

- \$2000 was provided to Judy's Hope a tiny house village designed to shelter women and children. The amount was based on a grant proposal presented by Kendall Welsh and Tabitha Tackett. Tabitha is a Trinity parishioner and the Executive Director of Judy's Hope.
- The second grant was a one time facilitation of the Nashville CARES gift cards to clients. Fifty \$50 gift cards were purchased from Walmart for a total of \$2500. The Christmas plate offering was designated to offset this expense.
- An additional grant application has been submitted by Project Transformation.

The Grants Committee consists of Christie Crawford, Harrison Holt, Phyllis Viltz, the rector, and the chair of the outreach committee.
