I keep coming back to the shepherds. Every year they grab my attention in a different way. They are regular men and women just going

about their work and minding their own business. The next thing you know, they are being addressed by an angel shining with the glory of the Lord telling them about a baby in nearby Bethlehem.

Then, a multitude of the heavenly host appears. To translate that, we are not talking about a whole bunch of heavenly beings. Host is a term for army. So, literally the shepherds are surrounded by the armies of heaven cheering and celebrating and rejoicing. The moment is one of overwhelming might and majesty and awe. I have to believe that they decided to go to Bethlehem as an escape more than a desire to confirm the good news.

While we plan to have a wonderful array of services and events celebrating the birth of Jesus, we will not have an army of any variety cheering for God and peace. We will instead have six services to cover just about any and every option for our community:

10:00 AM, December 24 - This service is designed to be meaningful celebration of Christmas in the chapel before the parking lots are packed and the chaos of Christmas Eve takes over. Patterned after the 8 am Sunday service, we will break bread together, hear the good news of Christ among us, and pray for peace.

1:00 PM, December 24 - This service will be for Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe (Our Lady of Guadalupe), our Spanish speaking community. They will sing, pray, celebrate, break bread, and rejoice together for the birth of Emmanuel – God With Us. Todo en español.

3:00 PM, December 24 - This service is our beloved and annual Christmas Pageant. All children are welcome to come 30 minutes before

the start to dress as an angel, a shepherd, or an animal and participate in our re-telling of the nativity. We will celebrate our families, share communion, and ponder anew the ways God draws near.

6:00 PM, December 24 – This service features the full choir, strings, communion, and the celebration of the nativity of our Lord. Many of our families who have aged out of the pageant love to come and reconnect at this service and celebrate Christmas together.

9:00 PM, December 24 – This service features all the bells and whistles possible for celebrating Christmas. We will sing carols with the choir and strings, hear the story of our faith, share communion, and use incense as a visible reminder of our prayers before God. This service is a beautiful way to welcome Christmas together.

10:00 AM, December 25 – This Christmas morning service is in the chapel, has plenty of parking, and is a quiet and meaningful celebration of the birth of our Lord. We will hear the story of Christ's birth, break bread together, and peacefully reflect on the miracle of God drawing near.
