As we turn toward a new program year at Holy Innocents', I keep coming back to a phrase from Luke's Gospel: "Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem." It's a turning point in the story—Jesus chooses love, even when it's hard. Even when it means sacrifice.

This fall, we're being invited to do the same: to set our face forward as a church, as individuals, as a community committed to raising up the next generation, welcoming the stranger, and serving with courage.

Dr. Kara Powell, a leading voice in youth and young adult ministry, says every young person is asking three big questions:

Who am I? Where do I belong? What is my purpose?

But these aren't just questions for young people. They're the same questions Jesus answered with his life. And they're the questions we're answering together this fall through vibrant ministries, renewed relationships, and bold love.

during her surgery and recovery. You've surrounded me with grace and strength. You've shown what it means to be the Body of Christ in real, tangible ways. And soon, we'll welcome the Rev. Dr. Bill Murray and Sean back from their sabbaticals on Sunday, August 17—a homecoming filled with joy and anticipation.

What is our purpose? To tell the story of what God has done—and is doing—in our lives. Like the man freed from the tombs in Luke 8, we are sent back into our neighborhoods and schools and work-places not just to live quietly, but to live boldly with love, purpose, and truth. This fall, we'll continue that mission through outreach, formation, music, worship, and shared leadership with our Spanish-speaking congregation.

Friends, we don't have to have it all figured out. But we are being called to take the next faithful step. To move forward—not backward. To live the way we already know how to live: with love that acts, hope that builds, and faith that follows.

So let's set our face toward this new season together—with eyes wide open, hearts stirred with purpose, and hands ready to serve.

Carve out the time and enjoy the wonder of God's creation, the world around us and the world inside of us. The experiences we carry, the love that we have for the people in our lives, the wounds that might still be healing. All of it is an opportunity to meet God anew, to rest in God's presence, to play.

SUMMER PROGRESS & PARISH GENEROSITY

Summer is in full swing and school is right around the corner. We have been busy at Holy Innocents with cleaning and organization projects in addition to unplanned challenges with AV equipment, kitchen equipment, electrical and HVAC issues. All works are in progress and being addressed! We remain in a good financial position through the summer due to several parishioners paying their pledges in full earlier than usual. We are so blessed to have such generous people with their talents and treasures. We are only \$1,350 short of our YTD budget for pledges of \$800,939 and over budget in loose plate and unpledged gifts. In addition, we have collected more money for facilities use than planned at this point in the year. Aside from salaries and pension, the largest spending categories are Utilities, Insurance, Facility Expenses, Custodial Fees, and Telecommunications. We are keeping close to budget so far this year. In addition, we budget \$60,000 annually for the Property Reserve fund for large unplanned building expenses.

The Holy Innocents community has once again generously given to those in need! *Parishioners donated \$34,000 for Holy Innocents of South Dakota that completely burned.* The Outreach Committee donated \$5,000. Thank you for so much generosity.



The Community of Hope will be offering a regional zoom training beginning Sunday, August 3rd. Community of Hope is an international organization, based on Benedictine spirituality, which equips people to participate in pastoral care.

Through ongoing, spiritual formation and practical lessons on care giving, members learn to align theological insights and spiritual practices with their experiences of ministering to others and giving spiritual care.

Pastoral care is when a person is being "present" in a listening, compassionate, non-controlling manner for the purpose of responding to their spiritual needs.

Training sessions will take place weekly on Sunday afternoons for 12 weeks, with an additional Saturday session.

For those who have completed training and decide to move forward in the parish with pastoral care ministry, we gather monthly as the Circle of Care on Monday nights for worship, continuing education, and spiritual support.

More than Bible study – through exploration, prayer, and reflection, trained mentors facilitate stimulating discussions and guide participants to examine life through an increasingly informed and inspired theological lens.



"I BELIEVE IN ONE GOD" 1700 YEARS OF THE NICENE CREED

In 2025, the global church marks 1700 years since the Council of Nicaea (325 AD), where the foundational words of the Nicene Creed began to take shape. To honor this milestone, the Rev. Dr. Gabrielle Thomas will help us explore the theological controversies that led to the Council, what was at stake for early Christian leaders, and why the Creed still matters today.

Dr. Thomas is Assistant Professor of Early Christianity and Anglican Studies at Emory's Candler School of Theology. An ordained priest in the Church of England and accomplished ecumenist, she brings deep insight and clarity to ancient theology and its relevance for today's church.
