
PENTECOST

Pentecost feels like a scene from a movie. The disciples are gathered in a room, unsure of what to do next now that Jesus has ascended. Suddenly there is a loud sound like a rushing wind and then tongues of fire appear above their heads and they begin to speak fluently in different languages. From this brief moment of interaction with the Holy Spirit, the disciples go out and preach the gospel message to the world.

Pentecost is a Greek word that means “fiftieth.” It is not just a Christian holiday; in fact, Pentecost is a celebration in Judaism. While we celebrate 50 days after Easter, Jews mark 50 days after Passover for Shavuot, a festival celebrating the giving of the Torah from Mt. Sinai. This is the beginning of the Jewish faith but not the Israelite and Hebrew people. (I will stop there before I start getting all sorts of things wrong.)

In our tradition, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and what has traditionally become known as the birthday of the church. Almost every church encourages folks to wear red, gather in prayer and praise, and often have some cake. We will do the same with an eye to the following Sunday when our Bishop Rob Wright comes to visit for Confirmation.

The Bishop’s hat, called a miter, and its unusual shape is intended to remind us of the tongues of fire on Pentecost. He comes to remind us that we are connected to a larger community, both the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta and the universal church of Jesus Christ. He will specifically lay his hands on our candidates, some 40 youth and adults, to welcome them into the church and invoke the presence of the Holy Spirit in their lives. It is a sacred moment that is all tied together through Pentecost.

So, I invite you to come to church two Sundays in a row—Pentecost on May 24 and Confirmation with Bishop Wright on May 31. We have so much to celebrate in the life of our church. So wear red, sing praises and celebrate, and we will definitely have cake.

After a nationwide search, the Vestry and Rector of Holy Innocents' Episcopal Church are delighted to share that Dock Anderson has accepted the call to be our next Director of Music.

“Dock is a perfect fit for our church and community,” said the Rev. Dr. Bill Murray. “His musical gifts are matched by his deep commitment to building relationships. With his Spanish-speaking skills and connections to the Atlanta Symphony and Temple Sinai, he is uniquely positioned to bring our communities together.”

Dock earned a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance, *cum laude*, from Birmingham-Southern College. Over the past 20 years, he has led choirs across a range of denominations and, for the last nine years, has served as Organist and Choirmaster at St. Margaret's Episcopal Church in Carrollton, where he more than doubled the size of the volunteer choir.

The Search Committee was especially excited by his experience with bell choirs, his fluency in Spanish, and his interest in growing music ministry with Our Lady of Guadalupe, the parish

school, and Temple Sinai. A joyful note: Dock is engaged to his partner of 10 years, Barry Crawford. They will be married at the end of May, followed by a honeymoon in France.

Dock shares, “It is a joy to begin my ministry at Holy Innocents. As we get to know one another, I invite you to share your heart with me—especially how our worship can nourish your faith. My door is always open.”

Dock will begin work with us in June. We look forward to welcoming him at a mid-week lunch on Wednesday, June 25, followed by a concert featuring patriotic music and a few of his favorite selections.

We will also give thanks for Randy Romig's time with us as Interim Director of Music on Sunday, June 28, before the choir takes a few weeks off for the summer.
