Pastor's Note by Stina Koppes



1 We know that if the tent that we live in on earth is torn down, we have a building from God. It's a house that isn't handmade, which is eternal and located in heaven. 2 We groan while we live in this residence.... 7 We live by faith and not by sight.... 14 The love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: one died for the sake of all; therefore, all died. 15 He died for the sake of all so that those who are alive should live not for themselves but for the one who died for them and was raised. 16 So then, from this point on we won't recognize people by human standards. Even though we used to know Christ by human standards, that isn't how we know him now. 17 So then, if anyone is in Christ, that person is part of the new creation. The old things have gone away, and look, new things have arrived!

~ 2 Corinthians 5:1-2,7,14-17

For Christians, springtime coincides with the Easter season, a Great Fifty Days that we celebrate beginning on Easter Sunday through the Feast of Pentecost. It is fitting to celebrate the Easter season in springtime for all of creation reveals the gift of new life, resurrected life, persistent life that defies the harshness of a long winter.

The mystery of Easter also celebrates the transformative nature of God who makes all things new. It's not simply resuscitated life, but it is a metamorphic life that we experience in this life and in the life to come.

As I mentioned in my Easter sermon, this kind of metamorphic life is messy. As Paul describes it in 2 Corinthians, it causes us to groan! Things get torn down and new life raises up. This kind of metamorphic life can feel overwhelming, but we are reminded repeatedly that it is not random or haphazard, it is controlled by the love of Christ. We need not fear.

My guess is that there is something going on in your life that is messy right now, where you are groaning and wondering how God will make it new. In my life, I experience that everyday as a mom of a newly minted teenager. We are at a tender time where the rapid changes of adolescence make it clear that new things are on the way everyday. It is exhausting and amazing.

As a church, we are also at a place of groaning, as our experiences of metamorphosis continue to penetrate every level of our work. We see it visibly as the kitchen is constructed, but also feel it in the ways we continue to change how we live together as a community, what programs we offer, and how we find one another. It is exhausting and amazing. It causes us to groan.

Through it all let us remember that we live by faith and not by sight. The love of Christ controls us. May God continue to work among us so that we too as a church may become a new creation, blessed deeply by the work of the Holy Spirit to reveal a little bit more of heaven on earth.



MN Annual Conference Love Offering

Each year, churches in the Minnesota Annual Conference take a Love Offering for missions in conjunction with our Annual Conference Session, which will take place in St. Cloud May 31-June 1 this year.

Bishop Lanette Plambeck invites congregations to pray about and participate in the Love Offering as an expression of our gratitude for God's blessings in our lives. Our Love Offering this year will tangibly share God's extravagant love with a hurting world by addressing the growing mental health needs in Minnesota.

"The 2023 Love Offering invites us into an opportunity to walk alongside those on the journey toward health and wholeness and to share the healing and transforming love of Christ," Bishop Lanette said in her letter to members and friends of Minnesota United Methodist churches.

2023 Recipients

Sixty percent of the Love Offering will fund a new grant that will support Minnesota UMC churches that have partnerships with mental health services offered in local schools or communities.

Thirty percent of the Love Offering will go to three Minnesota nonprofits engaged in mental health education and advocacy: Mental Health Connect, Mental Health Minnesota, and Minnesota Association for Children's Mental Health.

Finally, 10 percent of the Love Offering each year goes to Volunteers in Mission scholarships, which support first-time mission trip participants. Learn more about these recipients.
