Pastor's Note by Stina Koppes



I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, on the basis of God's mercy, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your reasonable act of worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of the mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. ~ Romans 12:1-2, NRSV

I spend a significant amount of time in committee meetings.

Earlier in my career, mentors presented this kind of administrative work as a burden to carry, almost like a "necessary evil" to plow through in order to get to "the real ministry." This attitude gained popular strength nationally in the early 2000's as many churches began to dismantle and disregard the spiritual work of committees.

To be fair, structures can get unwieldy. Bureaucracy can inflate. Time is precious. Some meetings truly are soul draining. Life, schedules, and resources change. Reformation was and is needed. We had reached a point where our shared practices were missing the mark. Modernization was needed in order to adapt to the evolving needs of society. However,

in our haste to make things accessible and exciting, something deeper was undervalued. Repeatedly in my ministry work over the decades I saw it thrown out across various church communities in favor of expediency and popular appeal.

The power of communal spiritual discernment that happens through a faithful committee.

S. Meg Funk, OSB describes spiritual discernment as "finding that still, small, 'as if' voice of God." Scriptures teach us that when we engage in the work of discernment we uncover "what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2)

The practices of spiritual discernment are both personal and social. Each day in our prayer time, we must devote ourselves to sorting our thoughts, listening to God through scripture and prayer, and being attentive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. We are also called to do this in our work together as the church and we get a chance to practice this especially when we serve on a ministry committee or team.

When a church is faithful, discernment happens everywhere, but especially in the work of committees. It is the heartbeat of our work together.

You may not even know that is what you were doing at a committee meeting, but you felt it. The connection or "Aha!" moments. The tug at your heart. The recognition of "Here I stand, and I can do no other."

It is sanctifying, renewing, and compelling when led by the Holy Spirit.

This year, I have spent a significant amount of time in committee meetings that were blessed with the practices of communal discernment. Faithful leaders who gave generously of their time, talents, and thoughts to prayerfully listen to the stirrings of the Holy Spirit, humbly obedient to the work of Christ, and ready to move at God's pace. Whether it be through the work of The Board, Finance, Staff Parish-Relations, Trustees, Nominations, Connections Team of the staff, discernment happens regularly through the people of Cross Winds. I am grateful for these leaders, honored to participate in the work, and ask for you to pray for our committees as we prepare to change leadership for the upcoming year. May the work ahead be as sanctifying, renewing, and compelling so that all may be welcomed to the glory of God.






