PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Continuity and Change at Christmas"

After serving as a decorated chaplain in the British Army during World War I, the Rev. Eric Milner-White took a post as chaplain at King's College. Concerned that the Great War had hardened attitudes toward religion in general and Christianity in particular, Milner-White developed a service called Nine Lessons and Carols. The service features readings and music designed to walk participants through the story of God's love for all people, which is made manifest in the Incarnation of our Lord. The service continues to this day and has been broadcast by the BBC since 1928.

As sad as it is, we have witnessed a decline in the church in North America, much like what Milner-White observed in Great Britain a century ago. Inspired by his vision, our Christmas Eve service this year will be based on the King's College liturgy. Though the format will be different from the way St. John's has celebrated in the past, all the elements you have come to love will be present. We will hear

a rich array of readings. Our talented St. John's Chorale, Bell Choir, and Children's Choir will enrich our worship, all supported by a string quartet and harp. We will sing beloved hymns, including "Hymn to the Christ Child," written by Pastor and Mrs. Gongaware for our congregation. We will celebrate our Lord's ongoing presence among us as we receive Jesus in the bread and wine of Holy Communion. It will be a joyous night!

After much prayer and consideration, we will not be holding a worship service at 7:00 am on Christmas morning. Please know that this decision was not made lightly. I recognize that this is a difficult change for some of you. I hope that you will plan to attend worship on Christmas Eve and celebrate the joy of Christ's birth with your loved ones on Christmas Day.

As we enter Advent and prepare for Christmas, please keep our staff and volunteers in your prayers. It is a joyous time, but also a very busy time. There is a flurry of activity, like the annual congregational meeting, the Christmas pageant, and various holiday gatherings.

Amid this very busy season, I pray you will see glimpses of God's grace at work in your life and in our world.



The Great Litany

This year, we will begin our Advent season by singing The Great Litany on the First Sunday of Advent. There was a time when processional litanies were quite common and indeed have a long history in the church, with litanies found in the liturgy as early as the fourth century. We see a remnant of the practice when we pray the *Kyrie* on Sundays at Holy Communion. The Litany as found in the *Lutheran Book of Worship* is an adaptation of the first English translation written by Thomas Cranmer in 1544. When describing his work to King Henry VIII, Cranmer said that the Litany, "will much excite and stir the hearts of all men unto devotion and godliness." As we enter into a season of reflection and anticipation, we pray that our hearts will also be moved to devotion and godliness."



Why is Pastor Wearing Pink (Rose) Vestments?

During the Advent season, there is often a different thematic focus for each Sunday. While these have by time and place, the one Sunday that has kept a consistent focus is the Third Sunday of Advent. It is called *Gaudete Sunday*, or Sunday of Joy, and is derived from the ancient entrance verse sung on that day, "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again, I say rejoice." (Philippians 4:4) It is the Sunday we shift our focus from "The Lord is coming" to "The Lord is at hand!" We will light a pink candle on the Advent and Pastor Robb will don a pink stole and chasuble to highlight the joy of the day.



The Vestry meeting was called to order on Thursday, November 21st, by Vestry President Steve Trayte. The following represents the highlights of our Vestry meeting:

- 1. Noted in attendance were all members, except previously excused Chris Tant and Barbara Harpe. Attending as an invited guest was Dan Prickett, Chair of the Finance Committee.
- 2. Pastor Harrell began the meeting with a prayer.
- 3. The October, 2024, Treasurer's Report was reviewed by Martha Harken. Dan Prickett reviewed the Finance Committee's proposed 2025 Budget. Dan discussed the financial stress that faces the Congregation considering decreasing contributions and increasing expense, especially in the insurance premiums. The proposed 2025 budget totals to an annual deficit exceeding \$100,000. Steve noted that this is the fruition of the necessity of "Investing in St. John's" as we move forward from the pandemic setbacks and the pastoral transitioning. The Vestry deliberated and approved the Budget with recommendation that the Congregation approve the budget at the December Annual Meeting. Dan was thanked for his and the Finance Committee's efforts and was excused from the meeting.
- 4. The October, 2024, Vestry Minutes were approved.
- 5. Pastor Harrell reviewed his previously distributed report. Pastor Harrell noted that the 2025 Vestry will hold its annual retreat on a TBD Saturday in January and the Installation of Vestry will take place during both services on January 5th.
- 6. The Vestry considered and approved the following actions:
- Called the Annual Congregational Meeting to take place on Sunday,
 December 8, 2024, following one service at 10:00 AM.
- Approved St. John's Pastor Emeritus Policy.
- Approved increasing the fee for renting a parking space to \$140 per month.
- Rescheduled the December Vestry Meeting to be held on Tuesday,
 December 17th, following the annual Staff and Vestry Christmas Social.
- 7. Pastor Harrell and Vice President William Dowd put forth the following slate of Vestry Officer Candidates: William Dowd President; Genevieve

Lagonera – Vice President; Martha Harken – Treasurer; Barbara Allen – Secretary. The Vestry deliberated and approved the proposed slate with recommendation that the Congregation elect these candidates at the December Annual Meeting.

Pastor Harrell and Vice President William Dowd then put forth the following slate of Vestry Member Candidates: Chris McDonough, Lewis Moore, Melissa Spaulding and Marshall Wilson. The Vestry deliberated and approved the proposed slate with recommendation that the Congregation elect these candidates at the December Annual Meeting.

Noted was the election by the Endowment Committee of Marc Marchant to serve as Trustee. The Vestry acknowledged such election with recommendation that the Congregation ratify this Trustee election at the December Annual Meeting.

- 8. The various Committee Chairpersons provided an update on the activities and action occurring within their areas, mostly via written reports that were distributed to the Vestry in advance of the meeting. Of note were the following actions:
- Elizabeth Marchant received approval to hold a "Low Country Mardi Gras" congregational social event on Saturday, March 1, 2025 to be hosted by Pastor Harrell – preparing and serving his favorite dishes.
- 9. There being no further business, President Trayte adjourned the meeting. The next regularly scheduled Vestry meeting will be Tuesday, December 17th, at 6:30PM Christmas Social at 5:30PM.
