PASTOR'S MESSAGE

1700 Years of Nicea

In 2025, it is difficult to imagine that there was once a time when the Christian faith existed without any formal statement of faith. The Church existed around faith in the Risen Christ, but as time went on, questions began to arise that the earliest Christians did not spend much time thinking about. What exactly was the relationship between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? Was Jesus a created being? How could a Son be equal to a Father? Did Jesus have a role in the creation of the world? Just how many Gods are there anyway, one or three?

As these questions became more prominent, division in the early church increased. The fledgling Jesus movement had survived the crucifixion of its leader and generations of oppression and persecution at the hands of the Roman Empire, but could it survive its own internal debates?

Two major parties emerged with different answers to these questions. The first, and by some accounts larger party, were the Arians, so named for the leader of their faction, the priest Arius. Arius taught that God is one and, therefore, could not be divided; thus, there could be no way that Jesus could be both God and human. He further taught that while Jesus was divine, he was only the "firstborn" of creation, meaning he was a creature made by God the Father and sharing some qualities with God the

Father, but was not God or equal to God. Jesus may have been a divine son, but he was not eternal like the Father and there was a time when he did not exist.

While popular, the ideas of Arius marked a departure from what Christians had taught since the beginning, that the Father and the Son are co-eternal and co-equal, sharing the same substance of divinity. The departure of Arius and his followers from this central teaching served to deepen tensions in the early church.

To quell the destabilizing effect of these divisions, Emperor Constantine invited all the bishops to gather in the coastal city of Nicea (now İznik, Türkiye) in 325 AD to settle this and other matters. During the council, the orthodox position was affirmed and the Arian position was denounced. This affirmation of Christian orthodoxy survives in the Nicene Creed, which was first written at the Council (it would be elaborated upon at the Council of Constantinople in 381).

Today, the Nicene Creed stands as the primary symbol of our essential unity with the teachings of the early church. It is a sign of our continuity with forebears in the Christian faith, a symbol of the most central ideas of what it means to hold the Christian faith. When we profess the Creed in worship, we stand in continuity and unity with Christians past, present, and future, spanning time, geography, and ecclesial differences.

Let us give thanks for the Nicene Creed and those brave souls who risked everything to put the Faith of the Church in writing for us. May we hold its tenets dear to our hearts.

Coffee with Pastor: Planning Your Funeral



The Lee-Freyschmidt Circle will meet at 10:30 on Wednesday, February 5th in the Parish Hall.



The Vestry meeting was called to order on Saturday, January 25th by Vestry President William Dowd. The following represents the highlights of our Vestry meeting:

- 1. Noted in attendance were all members. Excused were Melissa Spaulding and Martha Harken.
- 2. Pastor Robb Harrell began the meeting with a Prayer.
- 3. The December 2024 Vestry Minutes were approved.
- 4. Pastor Harrell gave his report during which the Vestry approved the requests for two weddings, one in 2025 and one in 2026.
- 5. Pastor Harrell made the motion to accept the donation of an iPad and new amplifier to update the existing sound system. An anonymous donor has given funds to purchase a new mixing board to complete the sound system upgrade. The motions were approved unanimously.
- 6. The 2024 Year end Treasurer's Report will be finalized and submitted at the February Vestry meeting.
- 7. Vestry approved the facilities request for *L'Organo* to hold an organ recital May 27, 2025.
