PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dating Easter

In February, I wrote about how 2025 marks 1700 years since the Council of Nicea was held. Nicea was incredibly important for several reasons, not the least of which was the composition of the Nicene Creed (it was edited in 381 at the Council of Constantinople). However, questions over the divinity of Jesus were not the only questions addressed by the bishops who gathered. One of the pressing issues surrounded the celebration of Easter.

Early Christian communities were highly localized. Regional churches had variations in ritual and calendar observances. This was especially the case with the celebration of Easter. Local churches had different ways of formulating the date of Easter. As Christianity spread and became more cosmopolitan, this led to confusion. When the bishops gathered at Nicea, they created a common formula for establishing the date of Easter that we still follow today. Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox.

The change was successful for a period of time, but due to a miscalculation in the number of solar days in the Julian calendar, the date March 21 (assumed to be the day of the equinox) drifted further and

further away from the actual equinox. In 1582, Gregory XIII reformed the calendar to match the solar year more precisely. The "new" calendar was adopted by Christians in the West, but rejected by Christians in the East, resulting in a division between when Western Christians (Roman Catholics and Protestants) and Eastern Christians (Greek, Russian, Serbian Orthodox, etc.) celebrate the feast. In the West, Easter can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25. In the East, it can fall between April 4 and May 8. The dates of the observance may fall up to a month apart.

The year 2025 is one of those rare years when the calendars happen to sync. It marks a particularly unifying event for the world's Christians to celebrate our greatest and most important feast together. And while there will be other years when the dates converge, this will come to an end in the year 2698.

There has been a renewed call to find a common date for Easter for all Christians. The resurrection of Jesus lies at the very heart of what it means to be a Christian. While there are many other areas where Christians differ, this is one thing that can and should unite us. Leaders in Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and Protestant communities have expressed a desire to see this unity come to fruition. May God grant us the will to make it so.





- **3.** The February 2025 Vestry Minutes were approved.
- **4.** Pastor Harrell gave his report during which the Vestry approved the requests for one wedding in April 2026. Pastor Harrell requested three (3) members of the congregation to attend the upcoming Synod Assembly to be held North Charleston in June.
- **5.** Vestry approved the use of donated funds specifically for the purchase of a new streaming box for the livestream.
