HIGHLIGHTED VERSES

Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures. Luke 24:27 (NRSV)

"Jesus then explained everything written about himself in the Scriptures, beginning with the Law of Moses and the Books of the Prophets." (CEV)

"Then he started at the beginning, with the Books of Moses, and went on through all the Prophets, pointing out everything in the Scriptures that referred to him." (MSG)

Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him, and he vanished from their sight. Luke 24:31 (NRSV)

- "And then, they were allowed to recognize Jesus. But when they saw who he was, he disappeared." (EXB)

Weekly Bible Study

DAILY PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord, open my eyes, my mind, and my heart, so I may clearly see you today, not only in your holy Word, but also in my own life. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Monday, May 1

"Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?" Luke 24:26

When Jesus lived among his disciples, he repeatedly told them he was

going to be "mocked and flogged and crucified" (Matthew 20:19), but they refused to believe it. Why was the Lord's suffering necessary? How have you come to accept the necessity of his suffering on your behalf?

Tuesday, May 2

As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us..." Luke 24:28-29

Though the two men had yet to identify him, they were drawn to this stranger and wanted more time with him. What is it about Jesus that makes him appealing to you? How does time spent studying his Word and worshiping him impact your life?

Wednesday, May 3

When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Luke 24:30

Every time we celebrate communion, we acknowledge the presence of the Lord in our midst. In the same way, when we pray before a meal, we are inviting him to dine with us. How might you be more intentional about including him at your table?

Thursday, May 4

Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him... Luke 24:31

Why do you think the two men didn't realize who Jesus was until that moment? Were they dim-witted? Spiritually blind? Or might Jesus have kept his identity hidden for a reason? What benefit might there have been in this slow reveal?

Friday, May 5

Then they told what had happened on the road and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread. Luke 24:35

The familiar way in which Jesus blessed the bread and broke it was the "aha!" moment for his followers. How and when does the Lord become real to you during our time of communion?

Saturday, May 6

Pray first, asking the Holy Spirit to guide you and teach you, then read tomorrow's Scripture passage in preparation for Sunday's worship service.
