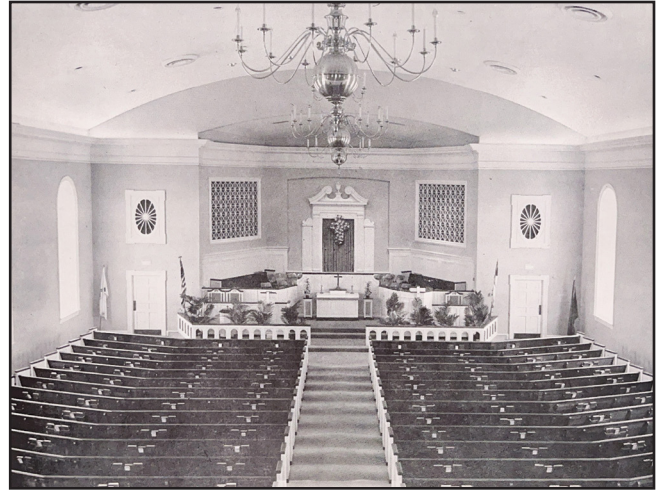


4. The Averitt Chapel cornerstone is just one of three commemorative cornerstones that mark important dates in CCUM history. Find the others and write what they say in the boxes below.

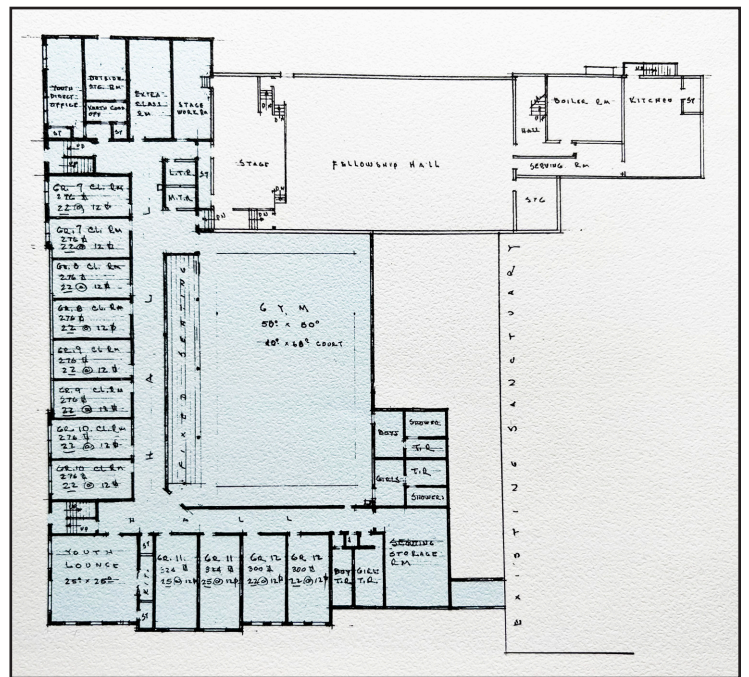
7. Today's chapel was the CCUM sanctuary from 1962 to 2009. Study this old photo and list at least two things that have changed in the space:
