Weekly Bible Study

Week of June 4 - 10

DAILY PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord, as I consider your great commission, remind me that, in the same way you sent forth your disciples, you also have sent me. Give me the courage, strength, and passion to teach others what it means to love, serve, and obey you. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Monday, June 5

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. Matthew 28:16

His followers went to a specific place "where Jesus had instructed them to go" (NTE). The Greek word *tássō* was an ancient military term that meant "designating, commissioning." So, not a suggestion; an order. How might this alter the way you hear the Lord's instruction to, for instance, "love your neighbor"? Merely a suggestion? Or a direct order from your commanding officer?

Tuesday, June 6

When they saw him, they worshiped him, but they doubted. Matthew 28:17

When they first spotted Jesus, some of the disciples "prostrated themselves before him; but some hesitated" (CJB), perhaps because they "did not believe that it was really Jesus" (ICB). Knowing his most devoted followers experienced moments of uncertainty, how can you manage your own doubts?

Wednesday, June 7

And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Matthew 28:18

Once "Jesus drew near" (GNT) so they could see him more clearly, and once they heard his voice "breaking the silence" (AMPC), the Lord gave his disciples exactly what they needed to put aside their doubts: proof of his authority. What convinces you that Jesus is the one who holds "all power in heaven and on earth" (NCV)? And how does his authority

impact your daily life?

Thursday, June 8

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations…teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. Matthew 28:19-20

The word *disciple* is both a noun and a verb. The Lord's disciples were called to disciple others, to "go out and train everyone you meet" (MSG), teaching them to become true followers of Christ in belief and in practice. Which is more challenging for you—*being* a disciple or *making* a disciple? How could you get better at both?

Friday, June 9

And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20

One answer to Thursday's question might be this assurance from Jesus: "I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day" (MSG). How do you know, absolutely, that the Lord is always with you? In what ways does that knowledge shape your thoughts and actions?

Saturday, June 10

Pray first, asking the Holy Spirit to guide you and teach you, then read tomorrow's Scripture passage in preparation for Sunday's worship service.
