#### **HIGHLIGHTED VERSES**

When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" Matthew 9:11 (NRSV)

## **Weekly Bible Study**

**Week of June 11 - 17** 

### DAILY PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord, you have shown me by example how to extend mercy to people who are seen as undesirables, as outsiders. Help me have the courage to follow you, as Matthew did. In Jesus' name, Amen.

### Monday, June 12

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax-collection station, and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. Matthew 9:9

It was one thing to call fishermen as his disciples, but to choose a tax collector, notorious for corruption and extortion, was something else entirely. How did adding Matthew to his flock advance the Lord's work in spreading the gospel? And how does it speak to you personally?

#### Tuesday, June 13

And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with Jesus and his disciples. Matthew 9:10 Jesus dined not only with Matthew, but also "a good many tax-collectors and other disreputable people came on the scene and joined him and his disciples" (Phillips). What does this suggest about the wideness of God's mercy? And what might he be asking of you?

## Wednesday, June 14

When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" Matthew 9:11 No surprise this: "when the Pharisees saw him keeping this kind of company, they had a fit, and lit into Jesus' followers" (MSG). Why do you suppose they expressed their displeasure to the disciples, rather than challenging Jesus directly? And what were they so angry and upset about?

## Thursday, June 15

But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick." Matthew 9:12 Since we see no evidence of physical illness among those dining with Jesus, what did he mean by "healthy people don't need a doctor, but sick people do" (CEB)? If he was referring to spiritual sickness, how would you define that? And how has Jesus served as a Great Physician to you?

## Friday, June 16

"Go and learn what this means, I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous but sinners." Matthew 9:13 Jesus told the Pharisees to "go away" (Phillips) and consider the meaning of Hosea 6:6, "It isn't your sacrifices and your gifts I want—I want you to be merciful" (TLB). Which is harder for you: sacrificing something you value, such as time or money, or extending kindness and mercy to someone who seems undeserving?

## Saturday, June 17

Pray first, asking the Holy Spirit to guide you and teach you, then read tomorrow's Scripture passage in preparation for Sunday's worship service.
