Sunday, July 23 Matthew 26:36-39

HIGHLIGHTED VERSES

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." Matthew 26:36 (NRSV)

• "then Jesus brought them to a garden grove, Gethsemane, and told them to sit down and wait while he went on ahead to pray" (TLB)

He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee and began to be grieved and agitated. Matthew 26:37 (NRSV)

• "he took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee and began to be in terrible distress and misery" (Phillips)

Then he said to them, "My soul is deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me." Matthew 26:38 (NRSV)

• "then saith he unto them, My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death: abide ye here, and watch with me" (ASV)

And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me, yet not what I want but what you want." Matthew 26:39 (NRSV)

• "he advanced a little and fell prostrate in prayer, saying, 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will'" (NABRE)

Weekly Bible Study

Week of July 23 - 29

DAILY PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord, give me the strength each day to put aside my own selfish desires and pray as your Son prayed: not my will, but your will. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Monday, July 24

... he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray."

Matthew 26:36

Jesus often chose to pray alone, so we're not surprised that he told his

disciples, "You sit here" (VOICE), while "I will go over there and talk with God" (WE). But then he took Peter, James and John with him. When you need to get serious about prayer, who in your inner circle of family or friends would you ask to pray with you? In what ways might their presence make a difference?

Tuesday, July 25

...{Jesus] began to be grieved and agitated. Matthew 26:37

Although Jesus surely knew this hour was coming, "he plunged into an agonizing sorrow" (MSG), as he was "filled with anguish and despair" (TLB). The original Greek stresses the *pain* he was experiencing, as well as a certain measure of *fear*. When you are suffering emotionally and spiritually, where do you turn for answers? How do you seek relief?

Wednesday, July 26

"My soul is deeply grieved, even to death." Matthew 26:38

When Jesus confessed to Peter, James and John, "I feel as if I am dying" (CEV), his sacrifice had already begun. The gospel accounts don't include any response from his followers, despite the anguish in his voice, "My soul is so full of sorrow I am ready to die" (NLV). What might you have said or done to comfort him?

Thursday, July 27

"My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me,..." Matthew 26:39

Leaving behind those closest to him, Jesus prayed alone to his heavenly Father, asking "if there is any way" (MSG) he might be spared, pleading "don't make me suffer by drinking from this cup" (CEV). Why is it important to know Jesus said these words, even if his disciples did not? And how do they speak to you, reading them now?

Friday, July 28

"...yet not what I want but what you want." Matthew 26:39

The hope of eternity hung on a single word: "nevertheless" (ASV); "however" (CEB); "but" (CEV). In that pivotal moment, Jesus surrendered his will to the will of his Father. How might you be changed if you followed Jesus' example, ending every prayer with, "not My will, but Yours be done" (VOICE)?

Saturday, July 29

Pray first, asking the Holy Spirit to guide you and teach you, then read tomorrow's Scripture passage in preparation for Sunday's worship service in the Chapel.
