Weekly Bible Study

Week of May 7 - 13

DAILY PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord, give me a deeper understanding of the heavenly place you have prepared for me, and let that knowledge provide comfort and hope, even when life gets hard. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Monday, May 8

Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. John 14:1

Think of a recent moment when you were "worried" (CEV) or "distressed" (Phillips). In a real and tangible way, how did your faith in God and the certainty of his presence ease your troubled heart?

Tuesday, May 9

If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him. John 14:7

Throughout this passage, Jesus emphasized that knowing him was the same as knowing his Father. What is your own perception of the Father? And of the Son? In what ways do you view them as similar? And how are they distinct?

Wednesday, May 10

Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me?" John 14:8-9

Philip seemed unclear about the Lord's true identity, even after being in his company for almost three years. In the end, what did it take for the disciples to be transformed from confused followers to fully committed believers?

Thursday, May 11

The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. John 14:10

Jesus explained that both the words he spoke and the works he performed were not done by his own initiative or authority, but by his Father's. Have you ever watched someone follow the Lord's example—speaking God's words and doing God's works, taking no credit for their actions? Could you do the same?

Friday, May 12

I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. John 14:13

This was an extraordinary promise from Jesus, but it did include a qualifier. What does it mean to ask for something "in his name?" And what do you make of his goal: "so the shining-greatness of the Father may be seen in the Son" (NLV)?

Saturday, May 13

Pray first, asking the Holy Spirit to guide you and teach you, then read tomorrow's Scripture passage in preparation for Sunday's worship service.
