How to Use this Prayer Guide

It is our hope that this Prayer Guide will be an effective tool for every member, from the youngest to the oldest, at Resurrection Methodist Church. It is divided into 4 weeks (Sept. 28 - Oct. 25), with a different theme each week, anchored by devotionals written by members of our congregation. Please include the weekly focus group in your prayer time as you read through each devotional, Scripture passage, and prayer. May we all experience the blessing of watching God work among us!

Spend a few minutes each day developing the following spiritual practices:

- PRAYER Begin each day with a prayer to allow God to prepare your mind to hear from Him.
- **SCRIPTURE** Read the verse and write it on your heart.
- PONDER Reflect on what God is asking you to do for the good of His kingdom through your commitment.

We look to God to answer these prayers and are grateful for the steps of faith that each family will take during this season of growth!



Jesus Teaches about Prayer

"When you pray, don't be like the hypocrites who love to pray publicly on street corners and in the synagogues where everyone can see them. I tell you the truth, that is all the reward they will ever get. But when you pray, shut the door behind you, and pray to your Father in private. Then your Father, who sees everything, will reward you.

When you pray, don't babble on and on as the Gentiles do.
They think their prayers are answered merely by repeating
their words again and again. Don't be like them, for your
Father knows exactly what you need even before you ask Him!
Pray like this:

DEVOTIONAL: TRUST

Focus: God is calling us to **step out** in **faith** and **trust** in Him.

Then Joshua said to the people, "Sanctify yourselves [for His purpose], for tomorrow the Lord will do wonders (miracles) among you." The Lord said to Joshua, "This day I will begin to magnify and exalt you in the sight of all Israel, so that they may know that just as I was with Moses, I will [also] be with you." Joshua said to the Israelites, "Come here," Joshua said, "...By this you shall know that the living God is among you... Behold, the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth is crossing over ahead of you [leading the way] into the Jordan." Joshua 3:5, 7, 9-11 (AMP)

It can be easy to say we trust in God...

...we know it is the right way to be, but it is not always simple to trust. Sometimes we get in our own way.

One day I was visiting a support group at a church I was not familiar with and didn't know the layout of the buildings. I was headed to the Outreach Center, and when I pulled into the parking lot, I saw many cars at one end, but not many at the other. I tried to read the sign ahead near the second building. I saw "St. Vincent de Paul" and "Children's Center", but I could not read the words at the bottom of the sign.

I didn't want to be late and started to feel nervous. So, I relied on my "common sense" since all the cars are here, this must be the correct entrance. I parked, walked up the path, and asked the greeter, "Where can I find the Caregivers' support Group?" She said, "Oh, that's down in the next building at the Outreach Center." I thanked her, and, as I walked along the sidewalk and got closer to the sign I had seen before, I realized that it did say "Outreach Center" along the bottom (the portion I couldn't read from the car).

DEVOTIONAL: TRUST

I had tried to rely on my own ability and ended up in the wrong place! Had I kept my focus and trust in God's leading, I would have driven forward just a little bit farther. Then I would have been close enough to the sign to read "Outreach Center" and know that God had indeed brought me to the correct location.

Psalm 91:2 reads, "This I declare about the Lord: He alone is my refuge, my place of safety; He is my God, and I trust Him."

Following God in our everyday lives takes trust. We may remember to trust Him for the big things, but we need to know that we can trust Him for the little things, too, and ALL things. He is worthy of our trust. To help me remember this, I wear a little ring around my finger that has Proverbs 3:5 engraved on it. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding." I keep it turned so that the word "Lord" is always facing toward me. Then, when I look down at my hands, I fix my gaze on the Lord.

Holy Spirit,



DEVOTIONAL: GOD'S PROMISES

Focus: God is calling us to remember our past and step toward the future.

And the people of Israel did just as Joshua commanded and took up twelve stones out of the midst of the Jordan, according to the number of the tribes of the people of Israel, just as the Lord told Joshua. And they carried them over with them to the place where they lodged and laid them down there. And Joshua set up twelve stones in the midst of the Jordan, in the place where the feet of the priests bearing the ark of the covenant had stood; and they are there to this day.

Joshua 4:8-9 FSV

God fulfilled his promises dramatically...

...when He instructed the Israelites to set up twelve stones as a memorial after they had crossed the Jordan River. Joshua piled them up in Gilgal, where the Israelites set up camp. The stones, to God's people, Israel, represent a constant reminder that Yahweh is a personal and powerful God, working wonders on behalf of His people, similar to the parting of the Red Sea, when the Israelites left Egypt forty years earlier. They commemorate the mighty acts of God on behalf of His people, but to non-believers, they were just rubble.

Just as the stones served as a reminder for Israel, we as believers today are encouraged to share our faith stories and God's works with the next generation. Acknowledging milestones in our spiritual journey helps us remember God's role in our lives and encourages us to continue trusting Him.





I'd like to share my memorial stones, the perpetual signs of God's Promises fulfilled in my life. I have confessed my sins, gotten rid of the things that stand between me and God, and I have asked for and received His intervention in my life. So to celebrate, I raise this stone and say to all who will look and listen, "Here's what God has done for me!"

When I was baptized as an infant at my home church, Centenary United Methodist, in Lebanon, IN. To this day, every baptism I witness affirms another child claimed by God.

When I met the woman of my dreams, and, with God's prodding, she became my wife and we were united as one. My father was so proud of me that day. Our Father in Heaven was pleased, as well.

When our son was born, we named him Jacob, according to our family's tradition. It was God's guidance that led me to that. Our Father in Heaven was pleased, too.

(Romans 15:4) God, we pray for our Sunday school classes and small group studies. Through fellowship and study of Your Word, may we grow in our faith and understanding.

Friday, Oct. 10

For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through Him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God. (2 Corinthians 1:20)

DEVOTIONAL: COMMITTED TO GOD

Focus: God is calling us to **re-dedicate** ourselves to Him and be **faithful** to His calling.

While the Israelites were camped at Gilgal on the plains of Jericho, they celebrated Passover on the evening of the fourteenth day of the month. The day after the Passover, that very day, they ate some of the produce of the land: unleavened bread and roasted grain. The manna stopped the day after they ate this food from the land; there was no longer any manna for the Israelites, but that year they ate the produce of Canaan.

Joshua 5:10-12

God made the decision...

...to let the Israelites wander in the wilderness for 40 years because of their disobedience, instead of letting them into the Promised Land immediately. With all of the challenges with living in the middle of nowhere, God never left them and already had a plan for them, regardless of how hopeless things felt. On top of this painful punishment. God still asked the Israelite men to circumcise themselves to fulfill His covenant to His people. It is the sign that they were set apart. They willingly went through extreme physical pain because of their faith in His promises, and this shows the Israelites' intense commitment to God. They followed His command because they know that God's way is the right way and the only way to live. The plan that the Creator has for us is much better than what we can do for ourselves which is why it is so important to carry out His Word.

Commitment to God is a "deep and active devotion demonstrated through actions, prayer, obedience, and a lifestyle of holiness and integrity." For example, reading our Bibles, praying daily, and setting aide time to connect with God on a deeper level.

DEVOTIONAL: COMMITTED TO GOD

As Colossians 3:2 says, we should "set [our] minds on things above, not on earthly things." This verse calls us to limit the things that distract us from connecting with God and committing fully to Him. We can also commit to God in the way we act and in the things we say wherever we may be. Are our actions pure and godly? Are we saying things that are harmful to others or things that lift them up?

Through our dedication to become fully focused followers of Christ, God can create many wonderful and miraculous things. For the Israelites, He turned their land to become fertile and no longer needed to constantly provide them with manna every single day in Canaan. This was a result of His contentment with His people fully devoting themselves to Him and showing greater admiration by listening clearly to His commands. This shows that, if we are obedient to God, He will provide for us in the ways that we need it most.

As the congregation of Resurrection Methodist Church, we need to devote ourselves physically, spiritually, and mentally if we want to see the Lord moving through our Church. Sometimes it's not always what we do together in our community, but what we as individuals do that can strengthen our Church. The commitment that each of us has with God means much more than the commitment of only one person.

DEVOTIONAL: SURRENDER

Focus: God is calling us to **be His servants** and **step forward** with humility, surrender, and worship.

Now when Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up and saw a man standing in front of him with a drawn sword in his hand. Joshua went up to him and asked, "Are you for us or for our enemies?" "Neither," he replied, "but as commander of the army of the Lord I have now come." Then Joshua fell facedown to the ground in reverence, and asked him, "What message does my Lord have for His servant?" The commander of the Lord's army replied, "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy." And Joshua did so.

Joshua 5:13-15

Joshua and the people of Israel...

...had been following their leader Moses through the wilderness for the last 40 years. When Moses passes, Joshua is named as his successor. Although he had Moses as a mentor, as the new commander of Israel's army, Joshua bore the weight of leadership. Yet, despite all the new duties of his new role, such as being responsible for the lives of the Israelites and conquering enemies, he made up his mind not to let all this go to his head, but to remember that ultimate authority rests, not with human leaders, but with God Himself. In other words, Joshua knew that he must surrender in order to win.

When I was a young superintendent, I was pulled off a project where I was second in command to do a hospital remodel project in the medical center, replacing a superintendent who had resigned. It was my first time running a project in lieu of being an assistant, and although I was nervous, I was stoked!

Once I got a couple of weeks into my new assignment, I realized that it wasn't just one project, but multiple remodel projects running simultaneously.



DEVOTIONAL: SURRENDER

I was getting thrown into the fire of managing infection control plans, containment walls, negative air machines and readings, coordinating with operations and safety personnel, badging requirements, utility shutdown scheduling and paperwork, running labor crews, learning the rules of the hospital, and how to communicate with irritated doctors, nurses, and administrators. And then about two months into the fiasco, the project manager resigned, and his replacement was even younger than I was.

I thought all I had to do was work harder. Concentrate. Work more hours. But, no matter what I did, I kept falling farther and farther behind, getting scolded more often, and having more and more eyes on me, which resulted in an increase in remedial work and paperwork.

Finally, one day, when I knew I was at my breaking point and going to completely fail, I walked outside and prayed for guidance. I don't remember the Lord specifically speaking to me, but after I finished praying, I put my ego aside, called my boss, and told him what the deal was. Turns out he already had an idea of what was going on, and he had been waiting for me to call him. He told me he had another superintendent available who was waiting on a project to start and that he'd send him down to give me a hand.

Things quickly got better; the projects got back on track, and the hospital operations staff backed off. I learned a lot through that experience, but mainly that if I hadn't been trying to do it all myself. If I had prayed for God's guidance and trusted Him at the beginning instead of waiting until things went south, then I wouldn't have had all the issues, anxiety, and sleepless nights that I did.

We need to always remember that God is the ultimate leader and that although we may have our own plans and want to do things our own way, we can't accomplish anything without Him. We must surrender to win!

Lord, please help us to put aside our pride and seek You, not only in times of trouble, but also in times of great joy, so that we keep You at the forefront of our lives at all times.



Thursday, Oct. 23

Commit your way (everything you have and do) to the LORD; trust in Him and He will do [what is best for you; sustain you].

(Psalm 37:5)

God, please remove all our doubt so we can fully commit our lives, our families, jobs, possessions, entrusting all to You.

Friday, Oct. 24

The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps. (Proverbs 16:9)

Heavenly Father, please purify our hearts so that our thoughts and desires always please You. Help us to remember to walk with You always as we build the Body of Christ.

Saturday, Oct. 25

If you need wisdom, ask your generous God, and He will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking.

(James 1:5)

Help us to always see Your wisdom, O Lord, so that we may always make decisions and choices that are in accordance with Your will for the Body of Christ.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

PERSONAL FAMILY COMMITMENT

Pray...Not until God hears you, but until you hear God.

Set aside an appointed time for this discernment, free from distraction, for your family to meet, pray, study, and discuss what your commitment will be. This time of holy conferencing might take 30 minutes to an hour, depending upon the number of family members and age of your children. Instruct each family member to consider sacrifices that God wants that person and the entire family to make in order to give. Be sure to include each child so that every family member has the opportunity to experience the joy of giving sacrificially to God. Know that God works through each of us, no matter how big or small the giver or the gift. Decide as a family what you will give, and write it down on the Commitment Card, which will be turned in on October 19, Commitment Sunday.

Thank God and praise Him for all He has given your family. "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows." (James 1:17)

When we obey, God's blessing radiates through us to others. As our Family of Believers has been obedient in the past, God has allowed us to reach even more people. As you pray for God to expand our Church's mission, ask Him to help you choose obedience and develop your ministry.

God calls all of us to actively serve one another. As our church family grows, so do the opportunities to serve! As we look forward, be ready to hear from God what your role will be with regard to your time, your talents, and your treasures.
