GETTING THE POINT

Read Mark 4:1-12

- 1. How many soils DON'T yield fruit? How many DO yield fruit? What do you take from this?
- 2. Contrast the scenes of verses 1 and 10. What is the significance of these differences?
- 3. According to verses 11 and 12, why did Jesus teach with stories rather than teaching straightforwardly?

Read Mark 4:13-20

- 4. What does Jesus mean by "the word"?
- 5. List the six distractions that keep the Word from taking root, in verses 15-19.
- 6. What distinguishes the persons who bear fruit from the ones who don't?

GETTING DEEPER

Read James 1:21

- 1. What key verb here characterizes our response to the "implanted word"?
- 2. What is the result of successfully implanting the word, according to James? According to Mark?

GETTING PERSONAL

- 1. What part of our fruitfulness is up to God? What part is up to us?
- 2. What does "receiving with meekness the implanted word" look like?
- 3. How does this passage relate to Mark's broader message about the coming of God's Kingdom?
- 4. Which of the six distractions do you think is most common in our Bucks County culture? Which do you personally need to guard against? How will you do that?
