GETTING THE POINT

Read Mark 6:30-38

- 1. What is the significance that the disciples and the crowd were led by Jesus into the desert?
- 2. What are the **literal** implications of the phrase "sheep without a shepherd"? What are the **figurative** implications?
- 3. How does this situation raise an impossible need?

Read Mark 6:39-44

- 4. Break down the action verbs in verse 41 what is the significance of each?
- 5. How does verse 41 point beyond that spring day in the countryside to something deeper?
- 6. How does verse 43 ratchet this to a "next level" miracle?

GETTING DEEPER

Read Numbers 11:21-23

- 1. What are some similarities between this scene in Numbers and the Mark 6 feeding miracle?
- 2. How does Jesus' role in Mark 6 supersede that of Moses in Numbers 11?

GETTING PERSONAL

- 1. Give a personal example of being satisfied. How does this example point to the inexhaustible resources of God?
- 2. When have you experienced the Lord drawing you into a desert where He provided for an impossible need in your life? Why do you think it had to happen in a "desert"?
- 3. Describe a situation in which God did NOT provide an inexhaustible supply, for you or for someone else. Why do you think this was so?
- 4. Who will you pray for to experience God's inexhaustible supply because of Easter 2025?
