GETTING STARTED

ICE BREAKER: Tell about a time when you confused someone for someone else.

KEY THOUGHT: Don't harden to Jesus; Hurry to Jesus

GETTING THE POINT

Read Mark 6:45-52

- 1. Point out examples of differentiation in these verses between Jesus and the disciples.
- 2. How does the phrase "pass by" point to Jesus as more than just a gifted human? (Hint: see Exodus 33:19 and 1 Kings 19:11-12).
- 3. What is significant in the phrase "It is I" = "I AM"? What does Mark want to get across here?
- 4. What is surprising about the disciples being "utterly astounded"? What is the connection between the loaves and their hardened hearts?

Read Mark 6:53-56

5. What contrasts do you see between the crowds here and the disciples in the previous scene?

GETTING DEEPER

Read Job 9:4-11 (with special attention to 4, 8, and 11)

- 1. What similar words and themes do you see in these verses and Mark 6:45-52?
- 2. How do these verses, along with Exodus 33:19 & 1 Kings 19:11-12 point to the deity of Jesus?

GETTING PERSONAL

- 1. Why does it matter whether Jesus was God, or a prophet empowered by God? What does it mean for us personally that God made the journey to come to us?
- 2. Mark uses the phrase "hardened hearts" of both the disciples and the religious leaders (for example, Mark 3:5). Looking at these examples, how does one's heart become hardened?
- 3. Where do you see a reluctance in yourself to run to Jesus with your needs? What can you do about this?
- 4. How might the privilege of proximity lead to hardening in your own heart? How can you avoid this?
