GETTING STARTED

ICE BREAKER: When have you thought you were greatest at something, only to be humbled?

KEY THOUGHT: As a follower of Jesus, get ready to invert your values

GETTING THE POINT

Read Mark 9:30-37

- 1. What word would you use to describe the disciples' argument over who is the greatest, coming immediately on the heels of Jesus teaching them about His death?
- 2. What was Jesus looking for in place of a desire for high rank?
- 3. How was a child an appropriate object lesson for the point Jesus wanted to make?

Read Mark 9:38-41

- 4. What might have been the positive motivation for the disciples' actions in verse 38?
- 5. What does Jesus indicate is the basis for inclusion in His Kingdom?

GETTING DEEPER

Read Philippians 2:6-8

- 1. What is so surprising about Jesus humbling Himself? How does His example inspire you?
- 2. What is the connection between humility and serving others?

GETTING PERSONAL

- 1. Which "misvalue" are you more likely to espouse: superiority or exclusivity?
- 2. What have you found helpful as a practical "antidote" to a personal feeling of superiority?
- 3. Tell about a time when, in your mind or your actions, you "excluded" a religious/spiritual person only to find out later you were wrong?
- 4. What is unsettling about seeing the Kingdom as wider than we are accustomed to? What is freeing?
- 5. What was important about Jesus' lessons here regarding superiority and exclusivity for Mark's first audience (Roman Christians)? What is important for us today?
