GETTING STARTED

ICE BREAKER: What's a question you would you like to ask God?

KEY THOUGHT: Failing to make God most important opens the door to deadly distractions

GETTING THE POINT

Read Mark 12:13-27 (May summarize for sake of time)

- 1. With what attitude are these questions posed to Jesus? Why do you say this?
- 2. How is the question about taxes intended to be a "no-win" question for Jesus?
- 3. How does Jesus' reference in verse 26 to Exodus 3:6 validate the reality of resurrection?
- 4. In both responses, what common focus does Jesus point His questioners to?

Read Mark 12:28-34

- 5. What indicates that this scribe probably had a different purpose than the other groups?
- 6. Why do you suppose Jesus validated the scribe's answer in verse 34?

GETTING DEEPER

Read Hosea 6:6

- 1. How does the message of this verse correspond with Mark 12:33?
- 2. How is this consistent with the overall emphasis of Jesus' answers to the three questions?

GETTING PERSONAL

- 1. What is your knee jerk reaction to Jesus' statement to "Render to Caesar"?
- 2. What is most encouraging to you about the reality of resurrection?
- 3. What do you think of Jesus after reading His responses to these questions?
- 4. Why do you think it's so challenging to love God with ALL our heart, soul, mind, and strength?
- 5. What are the results when we make God most important in our lives?
- 6. What challenges do you face in spending unhurried time with the Lord to get to know Him better? What can you do to work past these challenges?
