#### **GETTING STARTED**

ICE BREAKER: Give an example in real life or in a movie/novel when someone "controlled the room" by their self-control.

KEY THOUGHT: Despite appearances, Jesus is still the True King

### **GETTING THE POINT**

### Read Mark 15:1-15

- 1. Who seems to be controlling Jesus' fate here? What indicates they may not be in control?
- 2. What repeated phrase points to the true identity of Jesus? How does this identity contrast with His apparent circumstances?
- 3. What is ironic about Barabbas' release? How does he point to a larger reality?

## Read Mark 15:16-20

- 4. Point out the specific descriptions of abuse Jesus suffered here. What is the cumulative effect of reading these descriptions?
- 5. How does it change the impact of this passage to read it in light of the coronation of a Roman emperor?

#### **GETTING DEEPER**

### Read Isaiah 53:7

- 1. What parallels do you see between this prophecy and Mark 15?
- 2. What connection do you see between the Passover festival and this passage?

#### **GETTING PERSONAL**

- 1. Is it difficult for you to see someone as being in control of a situation even while they are silent? Why or why not?
- 2. What is your reaction to Pilate's handling of Jesus? To the crowd's handling of Jesus? To the soldiers' handling of Jesus?
- 3. What situation in your life seems out of control right now? How does Jesus' Kingship in the midst of trial and mockery speak to your situation?
