GETTING STARTED

ICE BREAKER: What is the farthest location you have visited and what was it like?

KEY THOUGHT: ***We who know God are blessed to bless those who don't***

GETTING THE POINT

Read Psalm 67

1. What is the connection between being blessed by God and being a blessing to others? (See also Numbers 6:24-26).
2. How does God's blessing to Abraham in Genesis 12:2-3 shape the way we understand the mission of God throughout Scripture?
3. The word “all” appears four times in this Psalm – what does that repetition teach us about God's heart for the nations?
4. In verse 4, why is God's righteous rule presented as good news rather than a threat?
5. What do you make of the repetition of “joy”-filled words?

GETTING DEEPER

Read Revelation 7:9-12

1. What similarities do you see between this scene and Psalm 67?
2. How do these passages together tell one unified story?

GETTING PERSONAL

1. Where do you see “global compassion fatigue” in your life, and what contributes to it?
2. When you hear the idea that we are “blessed to bless,” what practical changes might that require in your prayers, priorities, or lifestyle?
3. Of the three prayer focuses mentioned—missionaries, unreached peoples, and persecuted believers—which most stirs your heart right now? Why might that be?
4. If Revelation 7 is our guaranteed future, how should that certainty affect the way you pray?
5. What ongoing prayer practice do you expect to take away from this Boiler Room series?
