



A Superior Covenant Hebrews 8

I. (Vs 1-6) Jesus is in heaven serving as our High Priest.

(Vs 6) God's main goal in chapter 8 is to show the superiority of Jesus as our Priest because Jesus mediates a new covenant!

II. (Vs 7-13) Jesus mediates a new covenant for God's people.

What is a covenant?

A covenant is defined by Webster's Dictionary as a formal, solemn, and binding agreement.

In the Bible, a covenant is a binding, solemn, agreement between God and His people.

Why is there a need for a new covenant?

The first covenant could not lead to the forgiveness of sin. It was perfect in that God created it and established it for his purpose: revealed God's holiness, defined sin, and regulated Israel's life as God's covenant people.

Problem: It was inadequate because the people could not abide by it!


Why is the new covenant better?
