Opener

Would you rather spend more time reading God's Word or talking with others about him?

Read

1 Peter 3:15; Mark 16:15; Romans 15:13; John 5:39-40; 1 Corinthians 2:10-12, 16; Isaiah 55:11

Main Points

- 1. As we're instructed to be prepared too hare the good news of Jesus with others, with an attitude of gentleness and respect, it all starts with intimacy with him.
- 2. Keys to practicing witnessing are intimacy with Jesus and intentionality in our relationships with others.
- 3. Once you step into the opportunity to witness, its exhilarating to partner with him and get to be a part of someone's journey towards Jesus.
- 4. Two steps for practicing scripture (studying): (a) Interpretation read what it says and understand what it means (information), and (b) Meditation allow it to shape you (formation).
- 5. We cannot love what we do not know.
- 6. Reading scripture does not positionally make you more of a Christian, but it shows you more of Christ.

Bottom Line

<u>Witness</u>: As we walk with Jesus, witness will be a natural byproduct of deepening intimacy with him.

<u>Scripture</u>: We learn a lot about the gospel from scripture, but we also go back and read scripture in light of the gospel.
