## Opener

When you think of revival, do you mostly feel excitement, skepticism, or indifference?

## Read

Psalm 85:1-6; Romans 15:17-19; Acts 10:38; Matthew 4:23; 1 Corinthians 13:1-3;

## Main Points

1. Revival accelerates discipleship and mission.
2. We cannot plan or produce a revival, God must pour it out.
3. The working definition we're using for Revival (from *Longing for Revival* by James Choung and Ryan Pfeiffer): "A season of breakthrough in word, deed, and power that ushers in a new normal of kingdom experience and fruitfulness."
4. Biblical revival encompasses these three elements: (a) word, (b) deed, and (c) power.

## Engage with God in a Group

- Are you growing in the fruit of the Spirit or drifting toward the works of the flesh?
- Have you become indifferent about people who are without a relationship with Jesus?
- Are you harboring hatred or unforgiveness toward someone?
- Have you been excusing away sins in your life?
- Have you become overly busy or distracted that you have stopped prioritizing time with God?
- Has your love for Jesus grown cold, routine, or duty-driven?
- Are there broken relationships you're avoiding instead of healing?
- When was the last time you shared the gospel with non-believers?

## Bottom Line

We want a kind of revival where we rejoice in Jesus!
