## Opener

When have you been surprised by an outcome of a situation that you didn't think could happen?

## Read

Ezekiel 37:1-10; John 6:63; Ezekiel 37:13-14

## Main Points

1. The working definition we're using for Revival (from *Longing for Revival* by James Choung and Ryan Pfeiffer): "A season of breakthrough in word, deed, and power that ushers in a new normal of kingdom experience and fruitfulness."
2. God did not take Ezekiel to a resort or to a garden. God brought him to a valley of bones.
3. The beginnings of revival is God revealing the brokenness of reality.
4. Revivals acknowledge human helplessness.
5. Revivals call for a God-inspired vision beyond what you can see.
6. Revivals are Word-saturated and Spirit-empowered.
  - a. What made the dry bones come alive was the working together of the Word of God and the Spirit of God.
7. Revivals cause the church to stand united and on mission.
8. The agenda of Satan is destruction, and his strategy is division.

## Engage with God in a Group

- When you've been in a season of discouragement, what does obedience look like for you?
- How have you experienced the power of the Spirit in seasons of struggle?
- What role has the Word of God played in your life in the different seasons of life you've had?
- Where are the places in your life where you're longing for a breakthrough?
- Who has God put in your life that he's inviting you to encourage and pray for?
- Who is in your life that you could ask to pray for and encourage you?

## Bottom Line

A life that is longing for a breakthrough is fertile ground for a revival.
