To Start:

- What does it mean to have "unity of mind" as described in 1 Peter
 3:8? How can we cultivate this unity within our church community?
- Why do you think Peter emphasizes humility, sympathy, and brotherly love in our relationships? How do these qualities help us reflect Christ?



- 1 Peter 3:9-12 instructs us not to repay evil for evil. Can you share a personal example where you chose to respond with kindness instead of retaliation? What was the outcome?
- Peter encourages us to suffer with eternity in mind (1 Peter 3:13-14).
 How does an eternal perspective change the way we handle trials and persecution?
