





Beware of False Teachers April 6th - 2 Peter 2

To Start:

- Make sure everyone has become acquainted with each other.
- <u>Ice Breaker</u>: Have you ever been fooled by something that seemed trustworthy at first but turned out to be completely false? What happened, and how did it change the way you view things or people?



- Why do you think Peter emphasizes that he was an eyewitness to Jesus' majesty and not just passing on stories? How does this strengthen your faith and confidence in Scripture?
- What role does regularly reading and meditating on Scripture (like in Lectio Divina) play in guarding your heart and mind from false teaching?



• Have you ever seen the damage that false teaching has done in a church or among believers? What was the impact?

"Life in Community" How can you encourage your friends or small group to stay grounded in biblical truth together?



- False teachers often appeal to the flesh and make the gospel sound selfcentered (e.g., prosperity gospel). How does that distort the truth for people who don't know Jesus yet?
- How do you explain the difference between the true gospel and a false one when talking to someone unfamiliar with Christianity?
