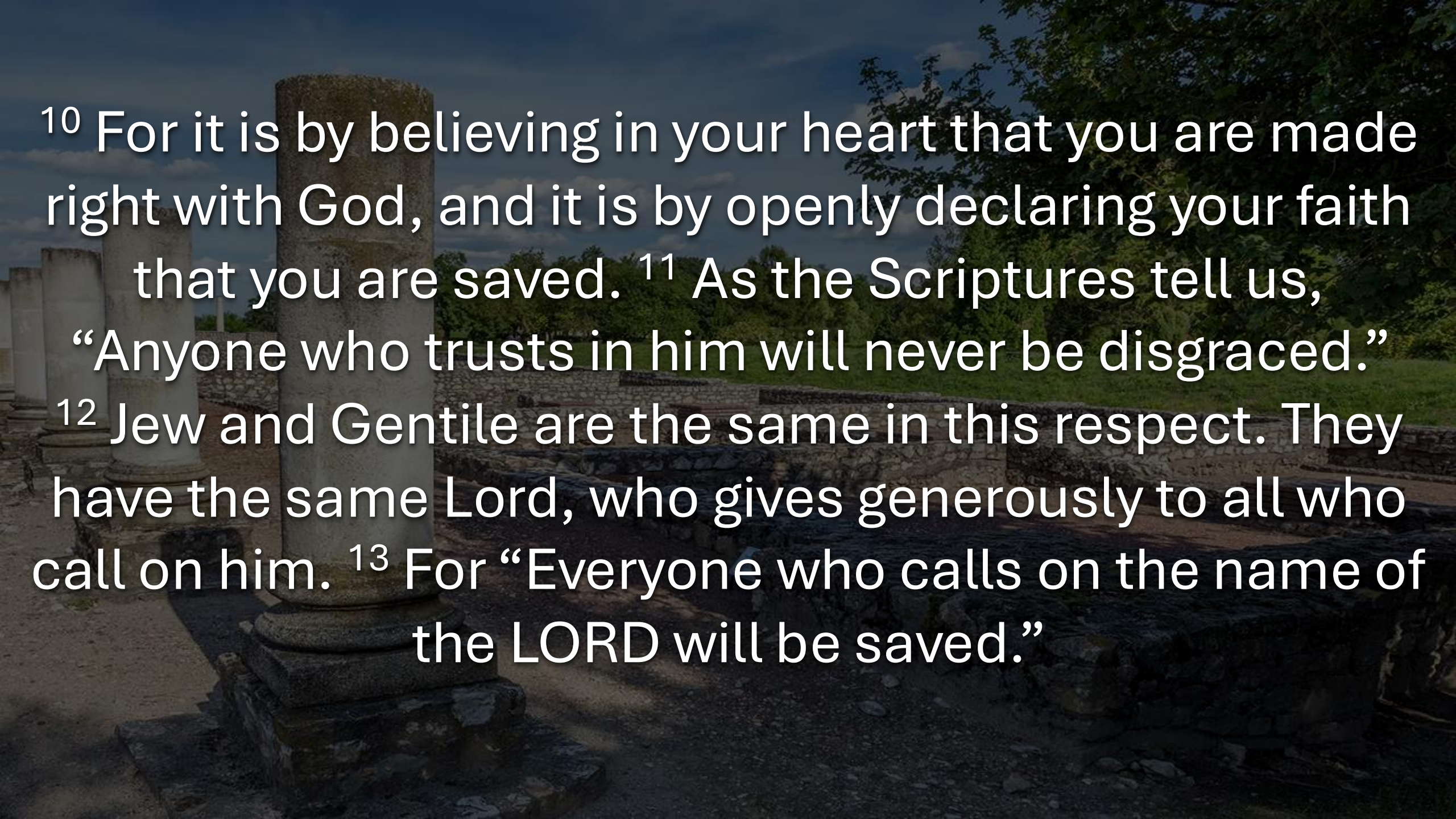
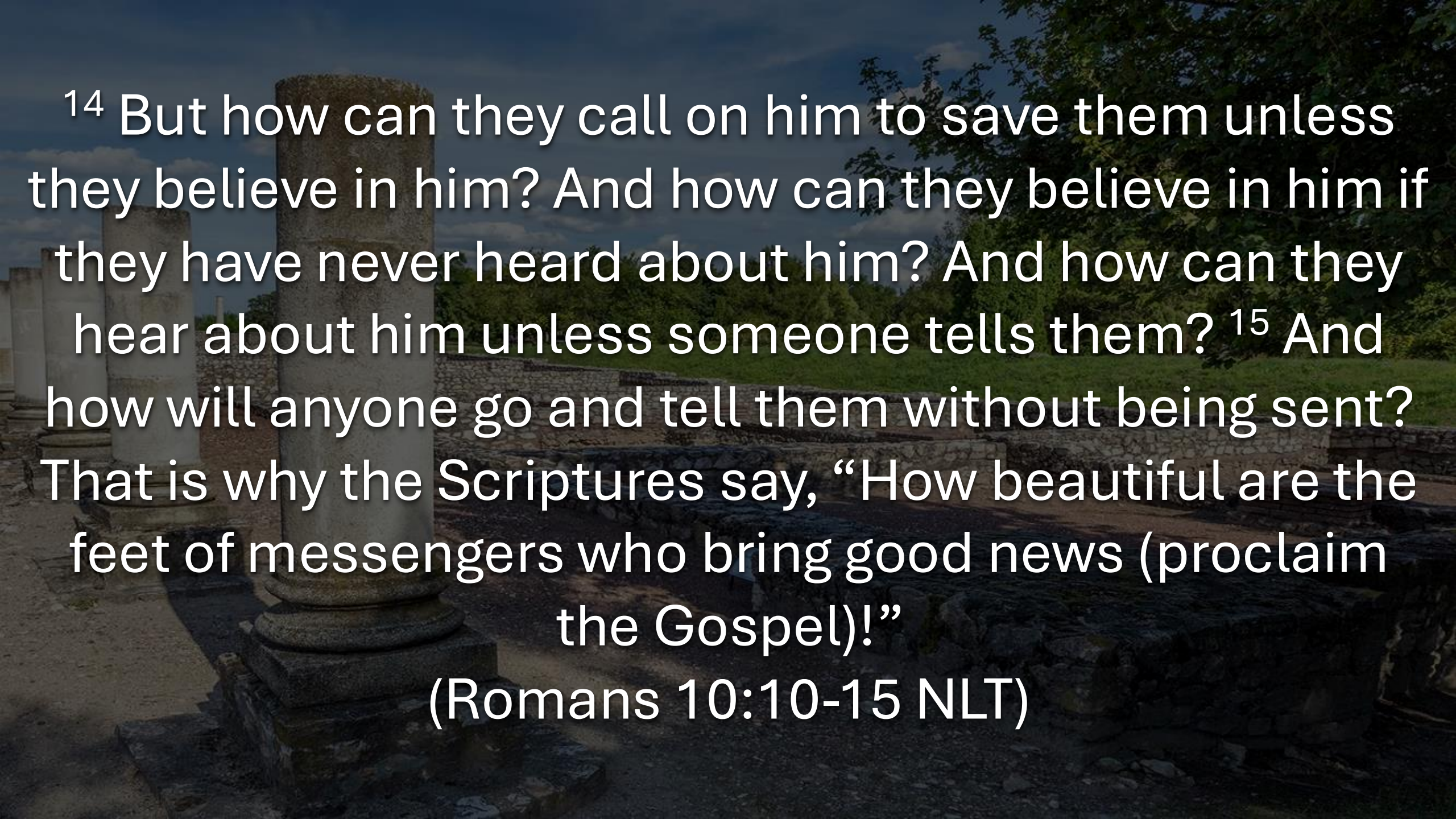

Gospel Fluency

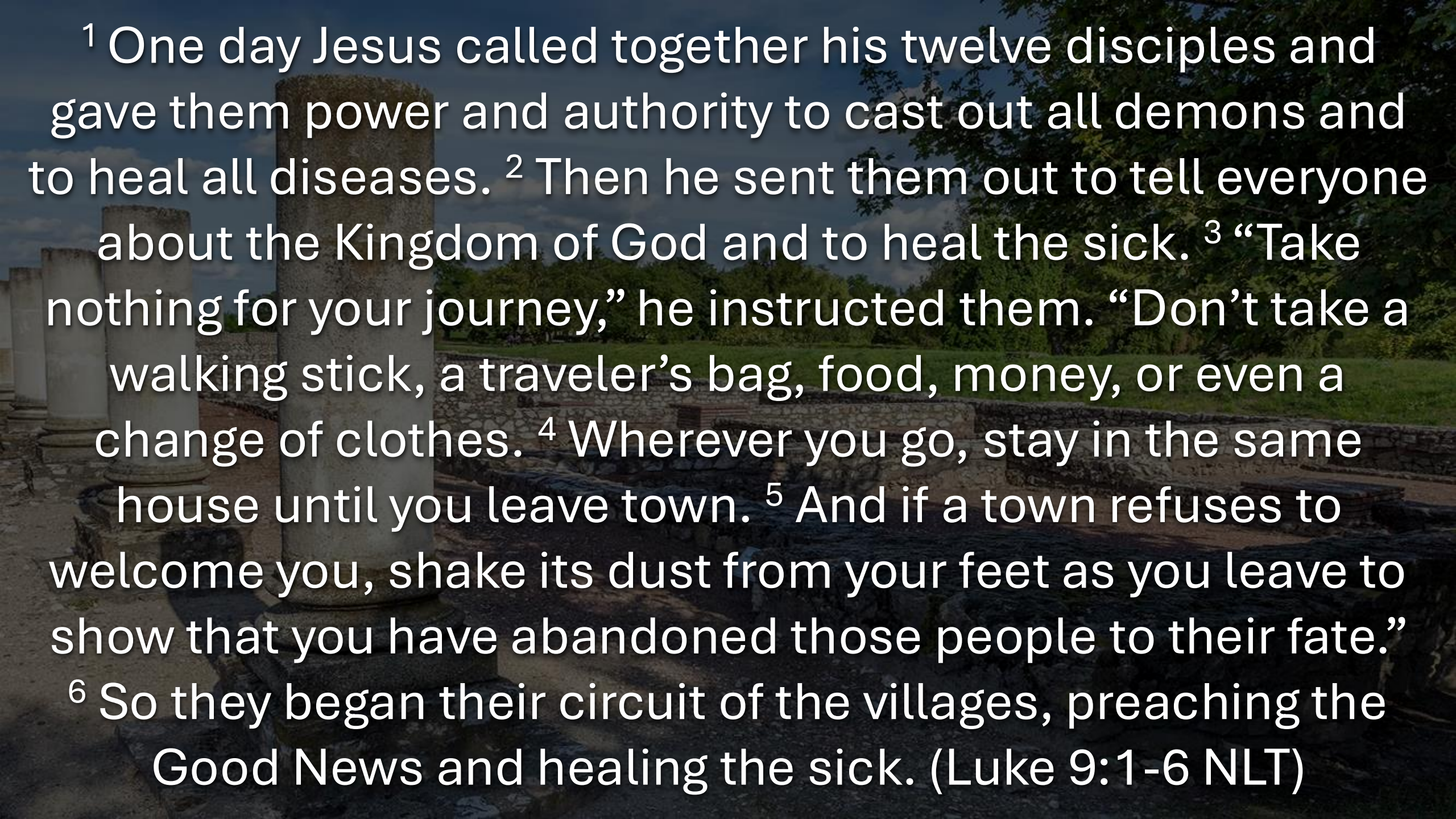
Those who are Gospel Fluent think, feel, and perceive everything through the lens of the Gospel, through what has been accomplished by Jesus Christ.

Fluency requires immersion.

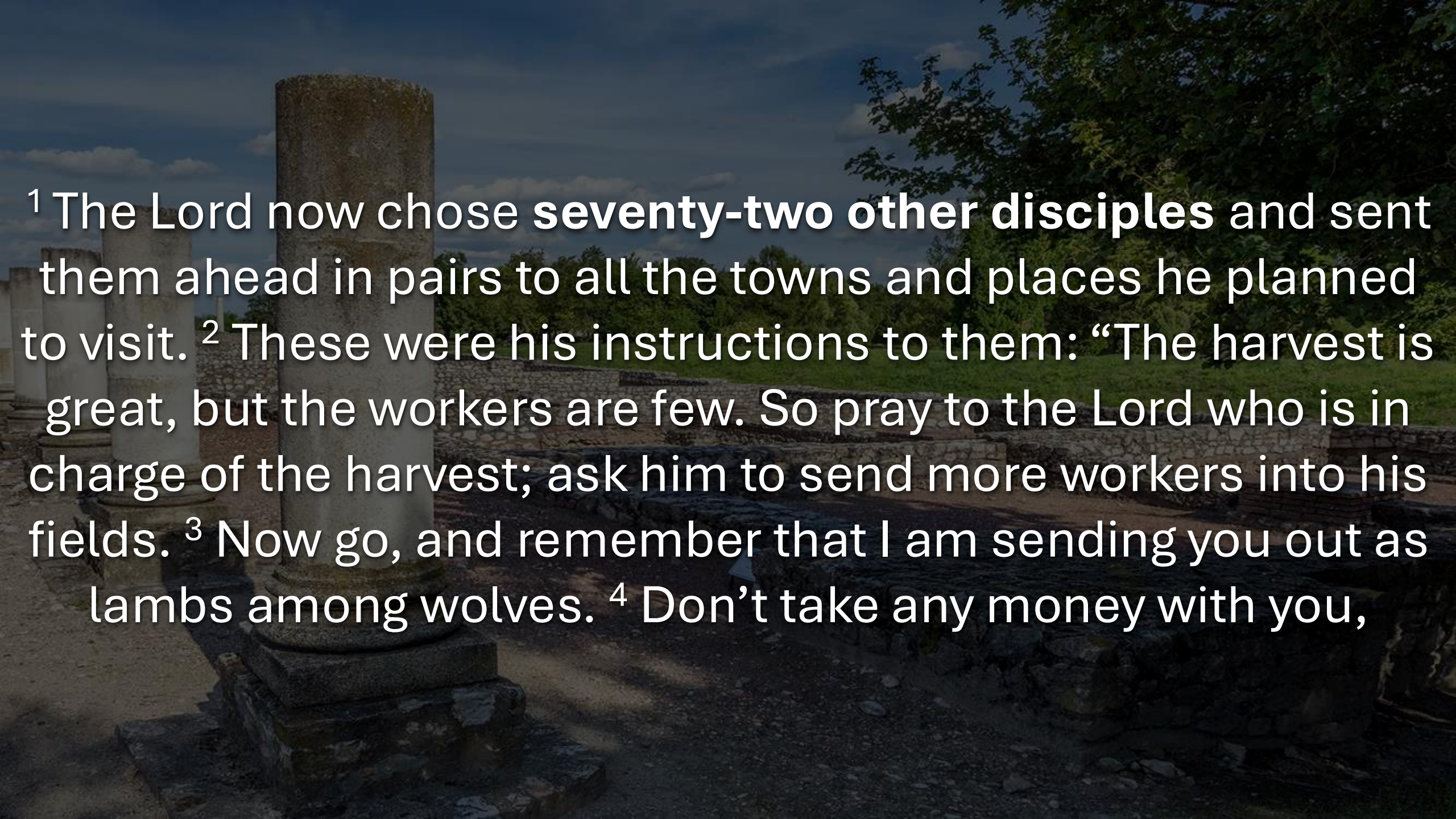
We immerse ourselves in the Gospel as we regularly and intentionally grow in our knowledge, application, and **communication** of the Gospel.

And don't stop to greet anyone on the road. ⁵ "Whenever you enter someone's home, first say, 'May God's peace be on this house.' ⁶ **If those who live there are peaceful, the blessing will stand; if they are not, the blessing will return to you. ⁷ Don't move around from home to home. Stay in one place, eating and drinking what they provide. Don't hesitate to accept hospitality, because those who work deserve their pay.**

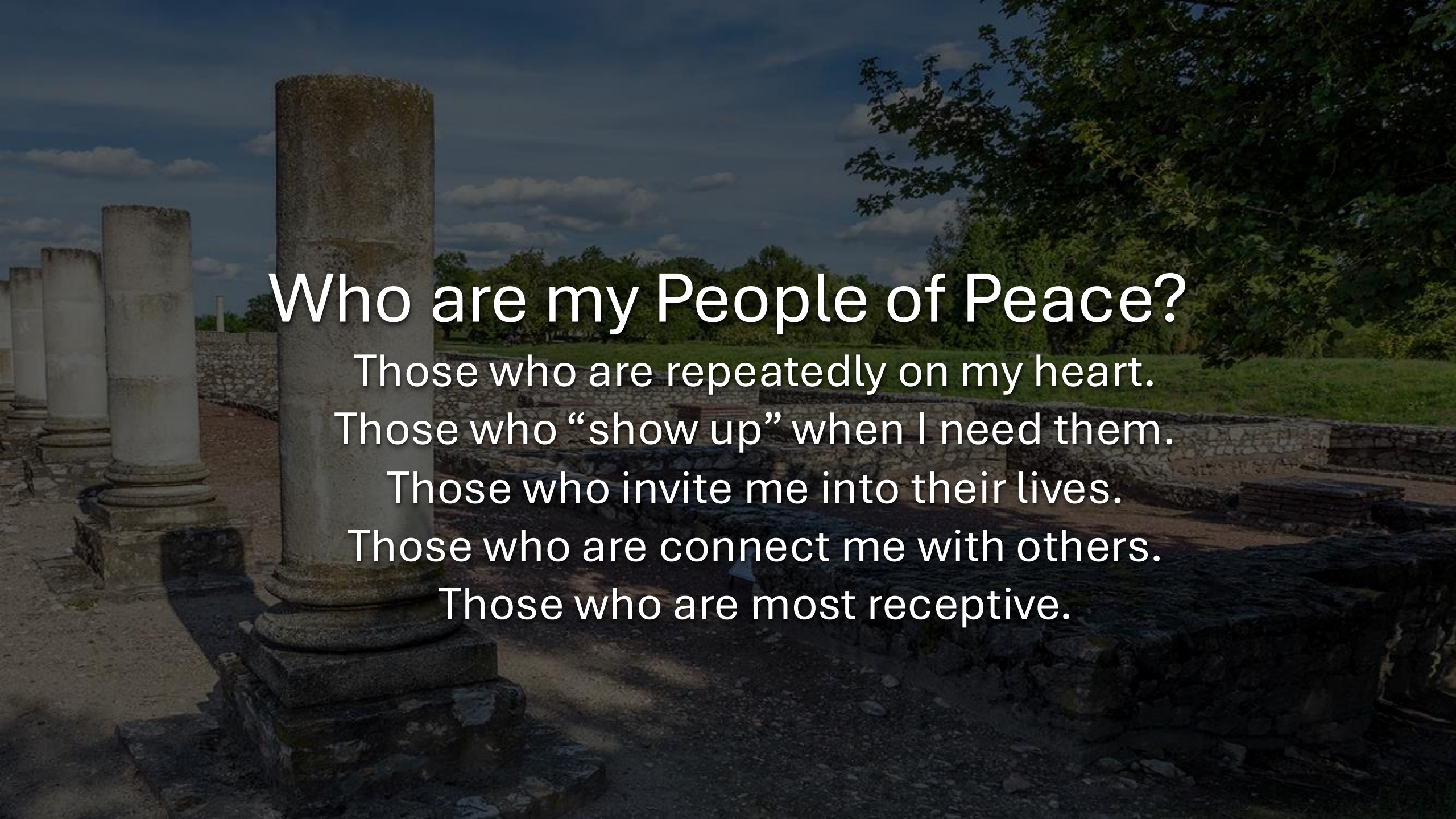
