



Stewarding God's Love

- Circle Time: Tell about a time that you went out of your way to help a stranger.
 - What prompted you to feel like you needed to help in that situation?
 - How were you personally impacted by that?
 - Have there been times that you walked by someone that needed help? Why?
 - How does time factor into whether you will help a stranger or not? *For instance, driving past someone pulled on the side of the road because you don't have or want to spend the time.*
- Read Luke 10:30-37
 - In his teaching, Pastor Harry taught about the idea of carrying with you the things that can help someone. How was the Samaritan uniquely prepared to help the man?
 - Think about the phrase, "Unreasonable Hospitality". Theorize together what that phrase could mean.
 - What were the reasonable things that the Samaritan did for the man?
 - How was the hospitality that the Samaritan showed the man, unreasonable?
- In his teaching, Pastor Harry said that. "Time is the most valuable commodity that we have." Why is this true?
 - Share a time that someone gave you their time. What did that mean to you?
 - Why do you think we value other people's time so much?
 - When is it easy to give someone your time?
 - When is it difficult to give someone your time?
 - When is it impossible to give someone your time?
 - What is the blessing you receive, or the return on investment when you give your time?
- A root of the word, "worship", is "WORTH-SHIP". Meaning that, people spend their time, energy, and resources on what is worthy to them. When we worship God we are expressing His worth to us.
 - How does this principle work in our human relationships as well?
- Respond to this final thought: "Worship is cyclical. We worship our creator with our time and resources. If we understand worship fully we follow his command to serve one another. Therefore, when we worship God by service one another we become an agent of His love to each other. As we worship Him, His love is declared for us all, through us."
