Call to Worship

A promise like No Other

The Promised Messiah – Micah 5:2, 4 (ERV); Isaiah 7:14; 9:2, 6-7 (NIrV)

But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, are the smallest town in Judah. Your family is almost too small to count, but the "Ruler of Israel" will come from you. His beginnings are from ancient times, from long, long ago. He will begin to rule Israel in the power of the Lord. Like a shepherd, he will lead his people in the wonderful name of the Lord his God. And they will live in safety because then his greatness will be known all over the world.

The LORD himself will give you a miraculous sign. The virgin is going to have a baby. She will give birth to a son. And he will be called Emmanuel (which means, God with us).

The Birth of Jesus - Luke 2:1, 3-7 (ERV)

It was about that same time that Caesar Augustus sent out an order to all people in the countries that were under Roman rule. The order said that everyone's name must be put on a list. Everyone traveled to their own hometowns to have their name put on the list.

So Joseph left Nazareth, a town in Galilee, and went to the town of Bethlehem in Judea. It was known as the town of David. Joseph went there because he was from the family of David. Joseph registered with Mary because they were engaged to be married and she was now pregnant. While Joseph and Mary were in Bethlehem, the time came for her to have the baby. She gave birth to her first son. She wrapped him up well and laid him in a manger – a box where cattle are fed. She put him there because the guest house was full.

<u>Leader</u>: God answered their prayers in just the right place. He sent his response in a sweet baby's face. His Son, the Prince of Peace, came down to the earth and slept in a manger the night of his birth.

The Shepherds and Angels - Luke 2:8-20 (NIrV)
