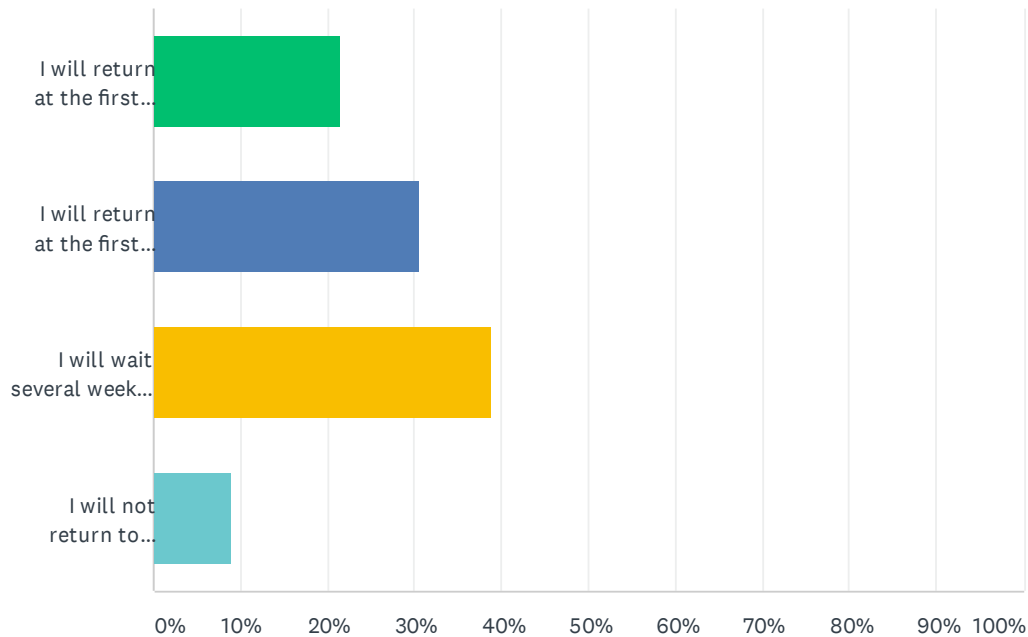


Q1 In general terms, when are you planning to return to an in-person worship service?

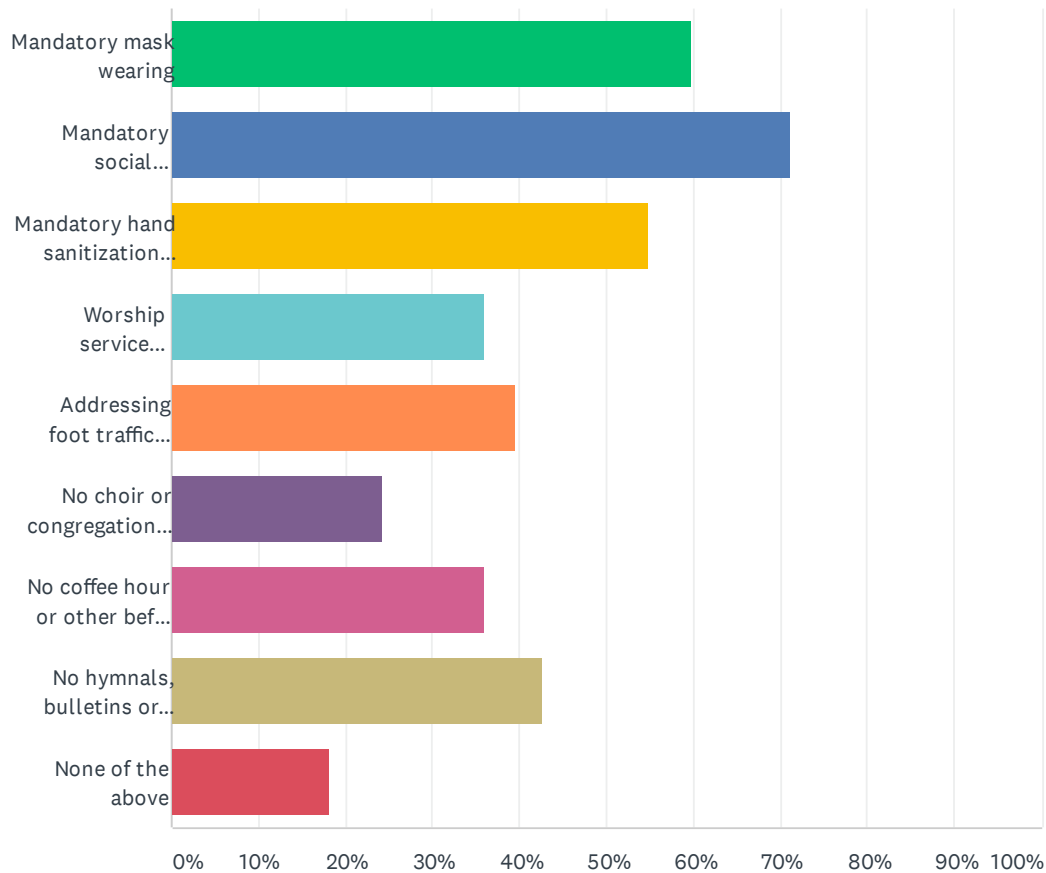

Q2 What health measures do you require to feel comfortable returning to an in-person worship service? (check all that apply)

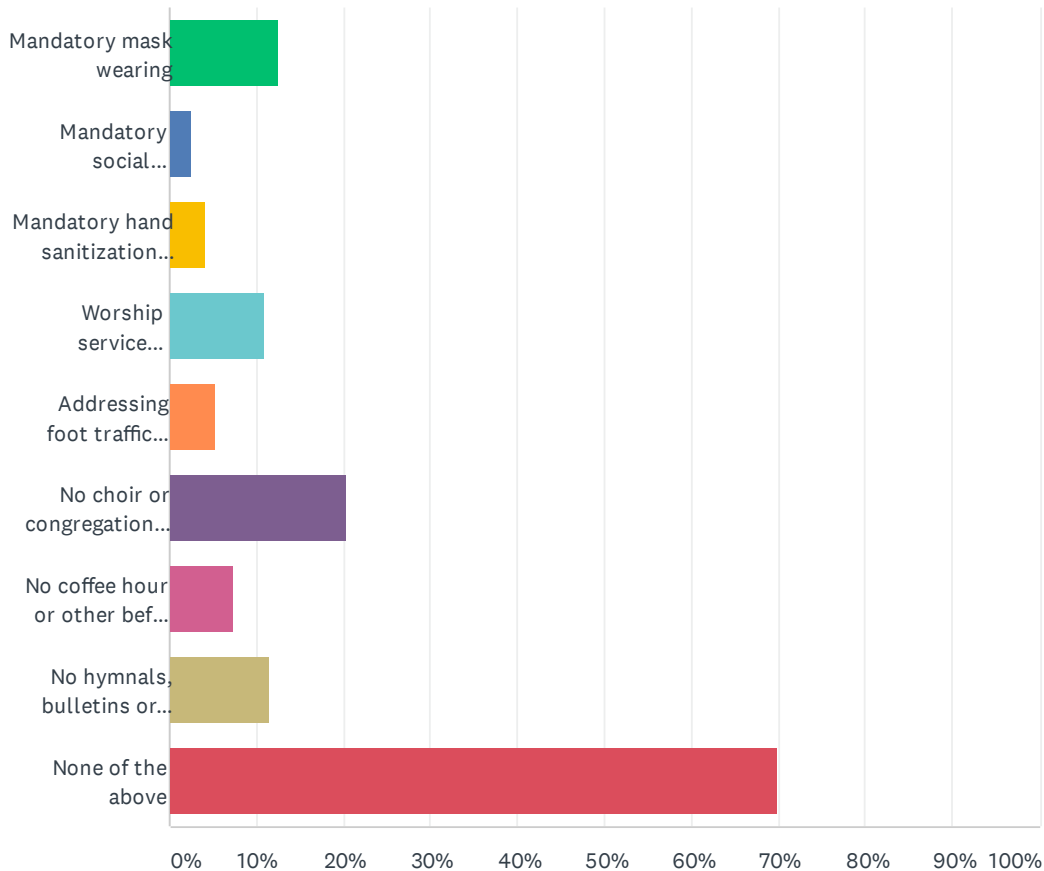

Q3 What health measures are you NOT willing to put up with as part of an in-person worship service, i.e., measures that would drive you to worship at home instead? (check all that apply)

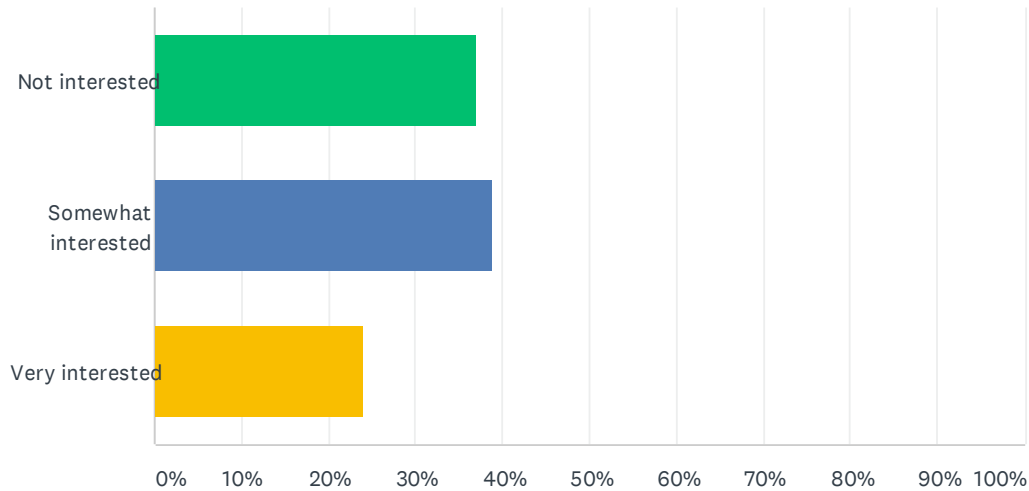

Q4 How interested would you be in participating in a brief drive-in or drive-through communion service, assuming the proper health measures are in place?

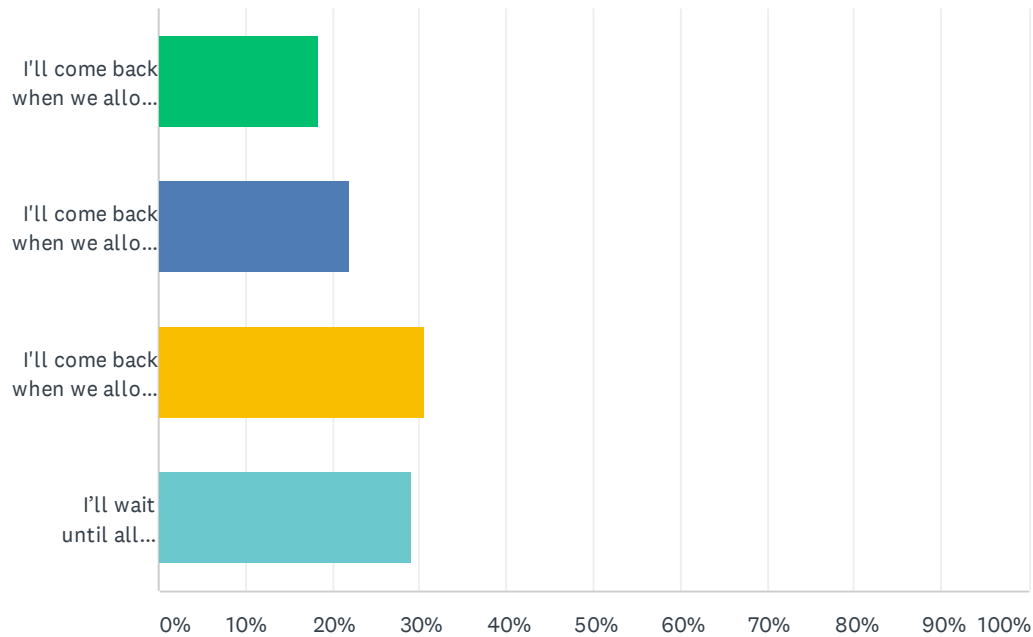

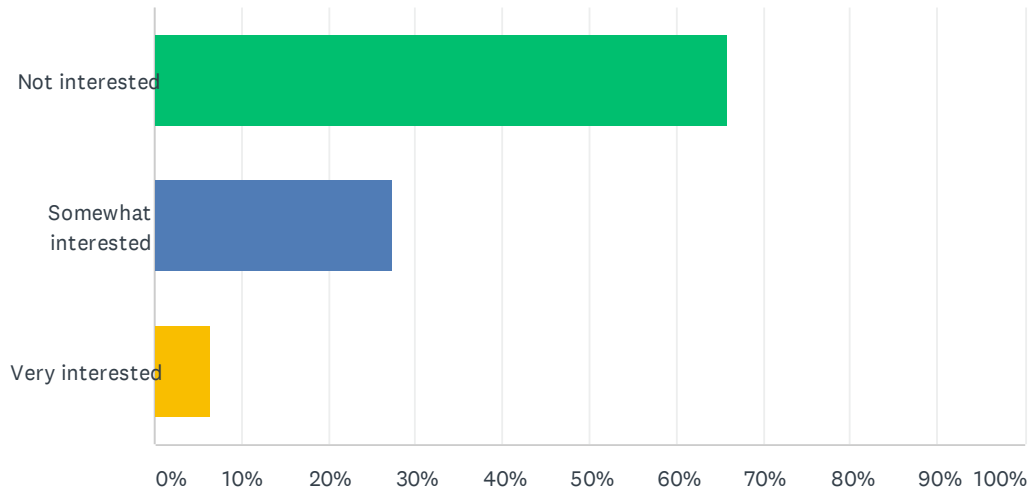

Q6 How interested would you be in using the downstairs chapel for personal reflection during certain hours of the week, ASSUMING the health measures listed in Question #2 are in place?

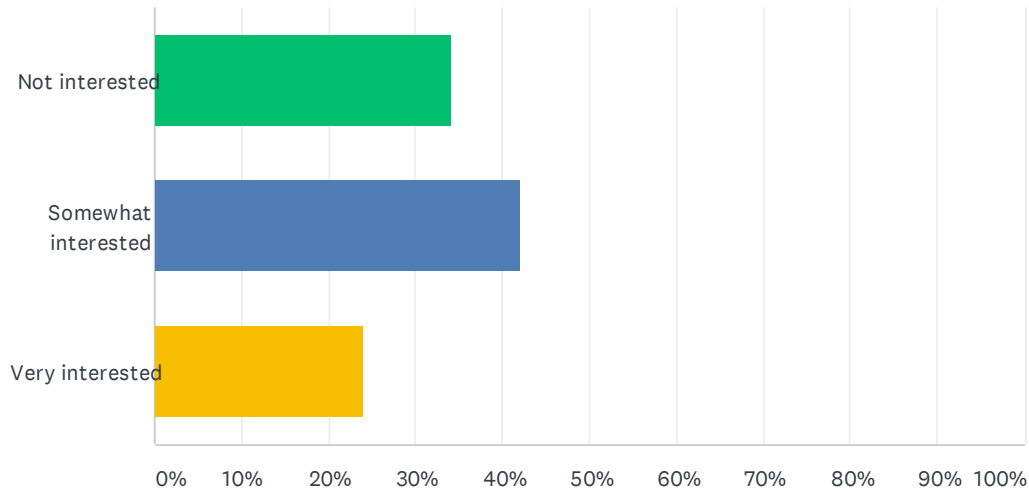

Q7 How interested would you be in attending OUTDOOR worship services using cars or groups of self-brought chairs as the means of social distancing?

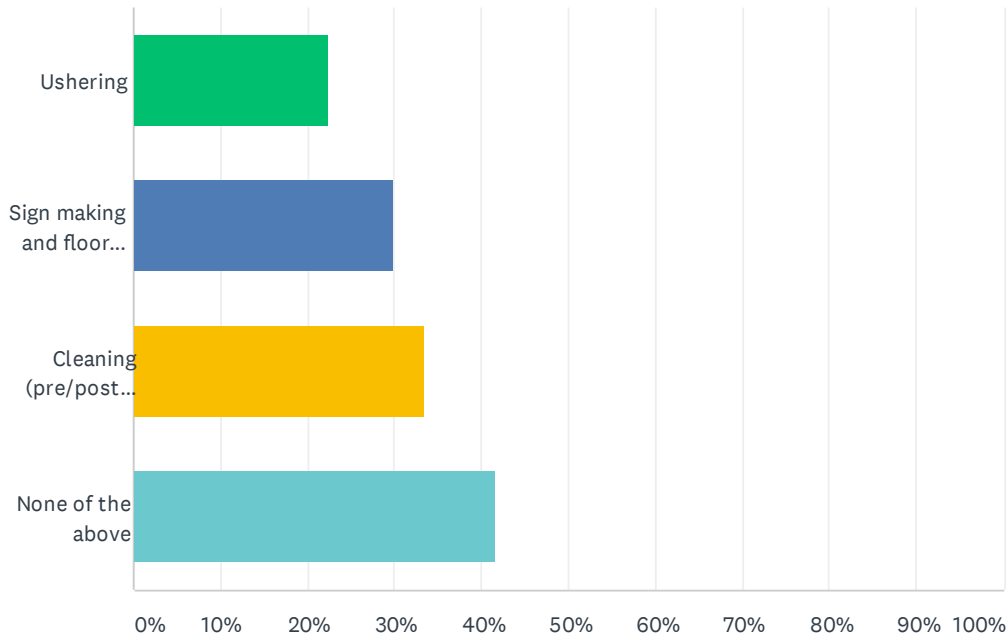

Q8 Safe services will require more volunteer resources to help us set up, usher and clean. For which of the following would you be willing to volunteer to help? (check all that apply)

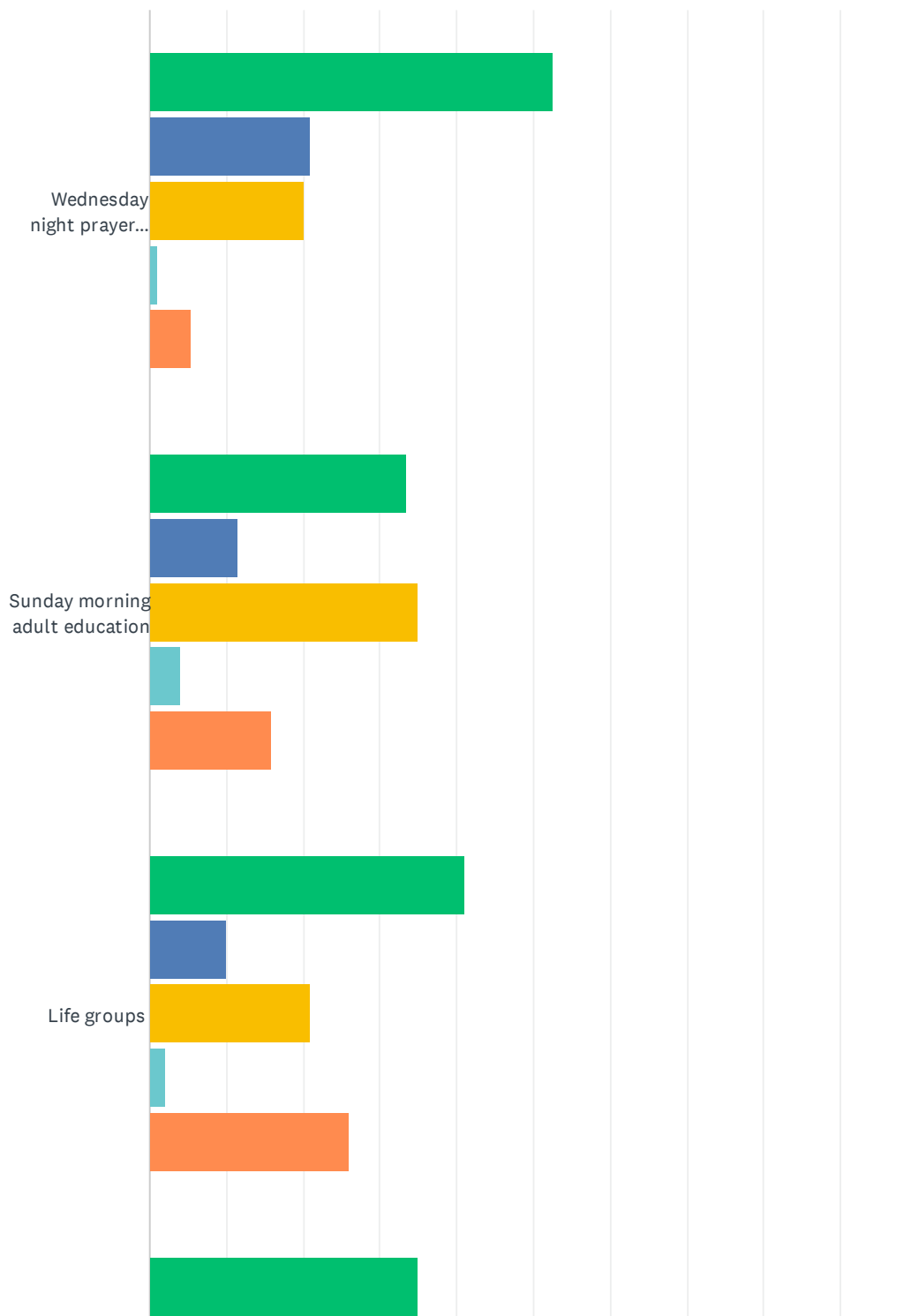

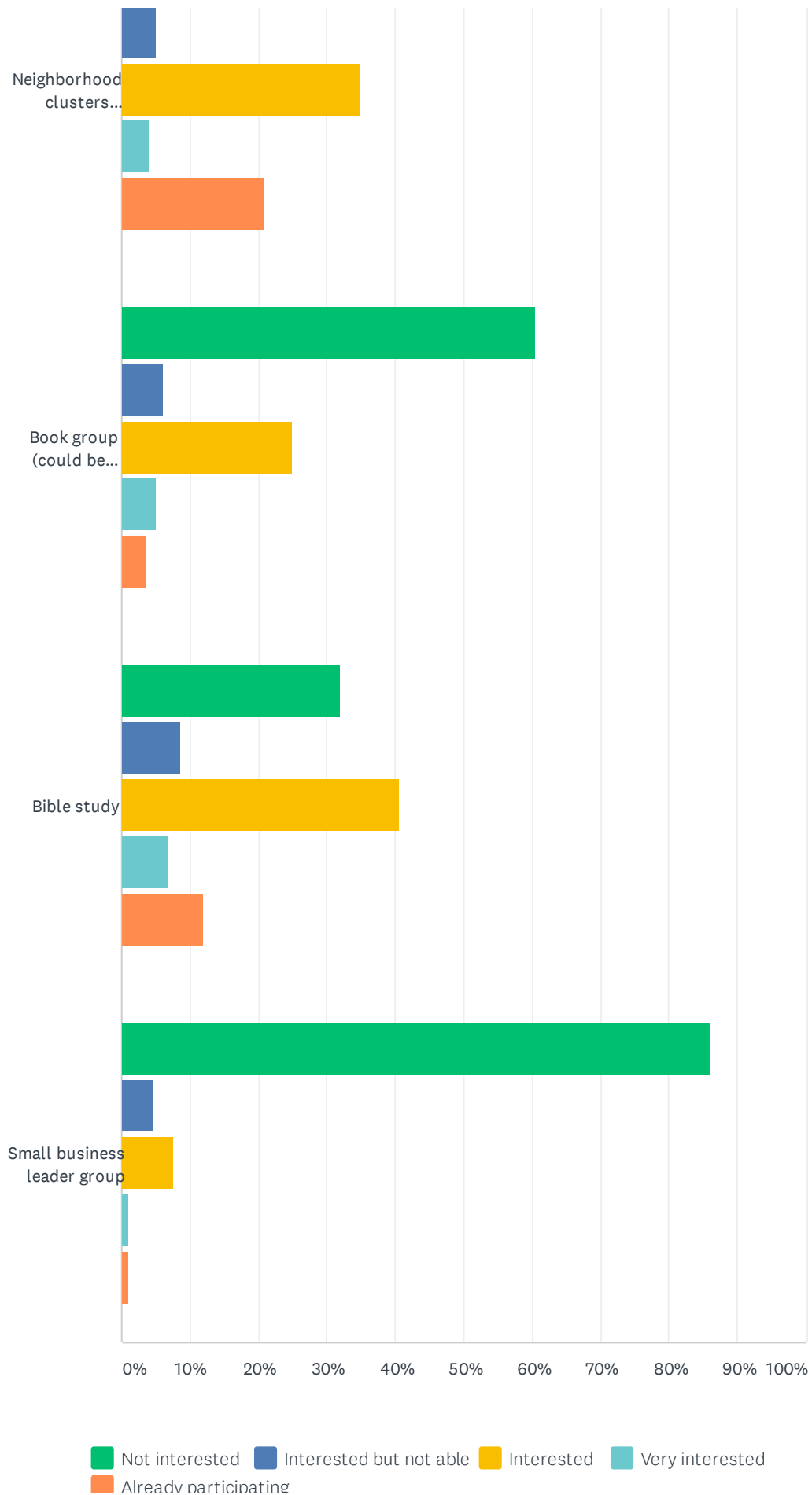
