Board approves changes to indoor worship

At its meeting Thursday night (March 18), the Board of Servant Leaders approved changes to indoor worship, beginning on Palm Sunday. These changes include (but are not limited to) the following:

- Raise worship capacity to 75
- Include congregational spoken liturgy (masked and distanced)
- Lengthen services from the currently shortened version (including more verses in hymns)

The Board will continue to assess all worship opportunities at future meetings.

Lent 2021: "Thy Will Be Done"

Lenten Wednesday services this year focus on the theme "Thy Will Be Done," with each week examining a different aspect of the theme. Wednesday services (in-person and virtual) will feature sermons as monologues of biblical characters. Pastor James's Sunday morning Adult Ed class is also following this topic.

The final Lenten Wednesday virtual service this year will be posted the evening of Wednesday, March 24, and we'll send out an email to let you know when it is ready. In this service we remember that Lydia followed the will of God by responding in faith and hospitality when the Gospel message of Christ's sacrifice was preached to her. We follow the will of God by responding in love and service to one another in return for what Christ has done for us.

In case you missed it: The March 17 Lenten Wednesday service, "God's Will and My Worldview," features a monologue by Pau. In this service we remember that, on the road to Damascus, Paul had his worldview turned upside down when God called him to preach the name of the Christ he had been persecuting. Due to COVID-19, the Giving Tree will operate in conjunction with the no-contact donation times of the SLHS Food Pantry. We will collect items Mondays 2-4 p.m. and Wednesdays 10 a.m.-noon. Helping Hungry Kids (HHK) has resumed limited operations. HHK is providing 300 weekend grocery packs to Dogwood Elementary, Cub Run and Aldrin Elementary. They are now packing at Northwest Federal Credit Union and are able to use a few volunteers with COVID guidelines in place. HHK needs help stocking their shelves at their new location.
