New schedule

On Sunday, December 5, Good Shepherd will begin holding three in-person worship services while also continuing its livestream, recorded, and podcast offerings. Our new schedule is like our pre-pandemic schedule, with an additional service! Here's the new schedule:

- **Indoor worship (sanctuary), 8 a.m.** Matins service, 2nd Sunday of each month (beginning December 12)
- **Outdoor worship (lower parking lot), 9 a.m.**
- **Sunday School** for children, youth, and adults, 10 a.m.
- **Indoor worship, 11 a.m.** Traditional services in the sanctuary, 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays; Praise services in the Fellowship Hall, 2nd and 4th Sundays. Kids' Messages will be a part of every 11:00 a.m. service, unless there is a baptism.
- **Livestream and recording:** 11:00 a.m. services each week

Holy Communion will continue to be a part of each week's outdoor worship service and will be offered at indoor services on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays in the sanctuary and on 4th Sundays during the Praise service.

Please continue to use the **online registration** forms for each worship service. Until we return to using the automated scheduler for worship assistants, our SignUp Genius forms offer a way to make sure we have ushers, greeters, communion assistants, and so on as needed at every service. Thanks to everyone who has faithfully served in these volunteer positions throughout the past year.

Sunday School for children and youth will be divided into these groups: preschool; K- grade 2; grades 3-6; middle school; high school. Sunday School will be held each week (except for December 26 and January 2). Please prayerfully consider if you could be a leader or facilitator for any of these Sunday School groups.

We will be taking a hybrid approach to Bible Study for adults. For adults on campus, there will be an informal (walk-in) Bible study each week, in the Fellowship Hall, that focuses on the day's scripture readings. We also hope to offer a **virtual Bible study on Sunday** morning as well. **Heidi Cooper's class** will continue to meet virtually on Tuesday nights through end of year.

Pastor Gary's Seven faith practices

What does letting Christ be King of your life look like? Pastor Gary offers these seven faith practices of the church , seven areas of our lives where our faith can work to reveal God’s light:

Worship: being an active part of the worshipping community is one way we exercise and strengthen our faith, witnessing to God’s power in our lives.

Study: as we seek to study God’s Word for our lives, we grow into God’s own likeness.

Pray: When we seek to increase our time spent in prayer, we grow our communication skills in talking to God and listening for God’s voice in our lives.

Serve: When we give of ourselves for the sake of our neighbor in need, we see Christ in those we serve, and we are blessed in our serving.

Give: we give of our resources, not so that the church can cover its expenses, but so that we are reminded that all that we have is a gift from our loving God.

Encourage: We are Christ’s hands and feet in this world when we support and encourage our brothers and sisters in Christ, fellow members of the body of Christ. And –

Invite: Just as we have been invited to experience God’s life-changing power, we too invite others to “Come and see” the God who meets us in Word and Sacrament. Our job is to invite, and trust that the Holy Spirit will do the rest.

Community Service and COVID-19. Active COVID protocols will be followed in most cases and are subject to change.

Angel Tree for Cornerstones. Thank you! With your help we were able to provide 153 gift cards each valued at \$25 for a total of \$3,825. We supported 23 families and a total of 60 kids. This year the Cornerstones Gifts for Kids program is providing gift cards to 800 families with a total of over 1500 kids. Thank you for your help!

North County Hypothermia Shelter. Good Shepherd will once again be supporting the Fairfax County hypothermia shelter every Wednesday, December through March. COVID-19 restrictions are allowing for in-person servers to return but they will be limited to 3 individuals (2 are preferred). All volunteers must be fully vaccinated (two shots of Pfizer/Moderna, one of J&J; extra booster even better) and provide proof (vaccination card) prior to “volunteering”. All servers must have their temperature checked and complete a short wellness check form on the evening they serve. Masks and gloves must be worn, and appropriate social distancing must be observed while in the hypothermia shelter. More volunteers may assist with getting the meal to the hypothermia room at the start of the evening and to take away everything at the end of the meal. Vaccination proof will only be done once if serving multiple times. All volunteers must be 18 years or older.

Meals should be delivered between 5:30 p.m. and 5:45 p.m. to the Hypothermia Shelter, located in the North County Human Services Building, 1850 Cameron Glen Drive in Reston, just ¼ mile from the Embry Rucker Shelter. Food should be delivered hot and in disposable containers, along with all the napkins, plates, cups, and plastic utensils needed for the evening. Restaurant food deliveries are also welcome! Please provide enough food for 40 people.
